MESSAGE FROM FR. JIM

Dear Parishioners,

As we prepare to gear up for the Road to Renewal, I want to share some things about it. I understand that people are nervous and have questions about this. My fellow priests and I have many of those same feelings and questions. Whenever, major changes are made there are going to be feelings of anxiety about it.

The purpose of the Road to Renewal is renewal of the faith here in the Diocese of Buffalo. It is to help all the faithful play a part in the life of not only their parish but the wider Church. The Road to Renewal respects parish life and the uniqueness of each parish while also helping people to understand that there are many benefits to Catholic life that are not just parish centered.

What can we expect? One thing is more active participation and opportunities with other parishes in the family. There are events, retreats, activities, etc. that parishes do that we might not be aware of, things we could greatly benefit from. We will see parishes working together for common goals while still acknowledging the uniqueness of each parish. Also, parishioners will have the opportunity to meet multiple priests as well. More leadership opportunities will be offered to parishioners both in the parish and in the family of parishes.

We also acknowledge that there are going to be some tradeoffs. Mass times on Sundays will most likely change. There might even be a Sunday communion service instead of Mass from time to time due to the limited number of priests. There is a good chance that Mass will not be celebrated every day during the weekdays at every parish.

Keep in mind that this is not something that only our diocese is doing. Most dioceses here in the United States either have gone through or are currently going through something like this. Also keep in mind that the way we currently operate now is a very 20th century American model.

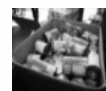

War on the Supernatural (continued)



Dr. Robert Barron draws attention to this very real epidemic in our times:

“A real concrete statistic around this is that 70 percent of the baptized faithful are staying away from Mass on a regular basis. And we’re doing well in comparison with the European countries. Vatican II said the Mass is the source of summit of the Christian life...everything leads to and flows from the Mass. The Eucharist is everything, and 70 percent could care less about it. Yes, there are many reasons around why some do not go to Mass, but I suspect that, for most, they are suffering from spiritual sloth; they could just care less”.

Aristotle said, “No one can long remain in sadness without any joy. “Depriving oneself of spiritual joy through neglect and sloth leaves one desperate to fill that void with inferior pleasures. Hence, it is no wonder why we see so many people frantically attempting to fill their lives with every kind of activity and distractions possible, desperately trying to avoid the gloom of emptiness. St. Augustine said, “You have made us for Yourself, Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You” (continued next week)

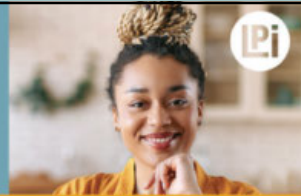
