From Fr. Mike's Desk

New Bulletin:



Beginning the weekend of September 30/October 1, our Family will have one bulletin for the parishes. This will

help keep communications consistent for all the parishes and we can all be informed and invited about and to events happening at one another's parishes.

Leaving something behind to go forward

As many of you know, twelve years ago, I converted to Catholicism. That began with an academic study (at a SUNY college) of media (television, advertising, social media, etc.) and how it shapes culture. I jumped off that bandwagon and became Catholic. In hindsight, it's the best decision I've ever made. I left so much of my old life behind, but it was the only way forward.

The world (as seen through media) is stranger today than ever before. At the same time, we know there are challenges in the Church. The Road to Renewal can be bumpy. It will be bumpy. Along with those bumps, persecution of the Church is on the rise. (If you don't already, I suggest you read VaticanNews.va, every day. Look at the World, the Church, the Vatican and Pope Francis through the eyes of religious media. You will see where I'm coming from.)

The question is: How do we respond?

I noticed about a year ago that people in some parishes began to pray the prayer to St. Michael after Mass. I was asked one day to lead the congregation in that prayer. I declined the offer; honestly, I was not comfortable with the request. But I didn't understand why.

I began to research the St. Michael prayer and how it was used in the Church. Back in 1884, the prayers came into use. Pope Leo XIII added the Leonine prayers to be were recited after Mass. Perfect, he was the pope, and that is his prerogative. The Leonine prayers included the prayer to Saint Michael.

Fast forward to 1964 when the Vatican Council begins. This included a major revision of our Liturgy. As part of this reform, the Vatican removed the Leonine prayers effective on the First Sunday of Lent in 1965 through the instruction titled: "Inter Oecumenici." This too was within the power of the Council. (There were reasons for these changes, and they are better explained by experts in their field. Father Paul Turner has an excellent article available in our parishes titled "Evaluating the Prayer to Saint Michael."

Thirty years later, according to an article in Simply Catholic, Pope John Paul II made this statement: Although the prayer is no longer recited at the end of Mass, I ask everyone not to forget it and to recite it to obtain help in the battle against the forces of darkness and against the spirit of the world.

So, on the one hand the prayer to Saint Michael is not forgotten, but should not be recited at the end of Mass.

And so: What do we do? We go forward. Together. For myself, I'm going to try hard to find time to read up on, follow, and promote the Eucharistic Revival that the United States Catholic Bishops are asking us to participate in. Their stated mission is to renew the church by enkindling in God's people a living relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. (USCCB.org/resources/welcome-national-eucharistic-revival.)

Yes, the program began over a year ago, and I'm behind the curve as it were. Have you seen it? Are you following it? Leading it?

You Asked...the Pastor Answered

You Asked: Will all the parishes be sharing equally in shared Family expenses?
