





My dear friends in Christ,



This Sunday we continue to read from the sixth chapter of John's Gospel, but not continuously. Our Lectionary omits John's report of Jesus' walking on water. This event is reported much less dramatically in John's Gospel than in the Synoptic Gospels


(Matthew, Mark and Luke). After the feeding of the multitudes, the disciples leave in a boat and Jesus follows them. The disciples are said to be terrified by what they see. Jesus reassures them and rejoins them. In today's Gospel, we learn that the crowd has noticed the departure of Jesus and his disciples and so seeks them out in Capernaum. In the dialogue that follows between Jesus and the crowds, Jesus unfolds for us the gift of himself that that he gives in the Eucharist.

In today's Gospel, there are four exchanges between Jesus and the crowd. In the first, the crowd, having followed Jesus to Capernaum, asks a very matter of fact question: "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus replies by naming their motivation in pursuing him. They have been fed. Jesus acknowledges this, yet challenges them to see beyond the fulfillment of their material needs. The crowds have followed Jesus because they have been fed. They ought to be seeking out Jesus because he can give them eternal life.

As the second dialogue begins, it seems that the crowd might be on their way to accepting Jesus and his mission. They ask: "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus replies that they must have faith in the one sent from God. But in the third dialogue, the crowd reveals their inability to see Jesus' true identity. They ask Jesus for a sign so that they might know that Jesus is from God. How strange this sounds since Jesus has just fed more than 5000 people. What more is expected?

But the crowd cannot see beyond the surface of the sign. They show this in their interpretation of the sign that came from Moses. In their description, they identify Jesus with Moses, as if to say, as Moses gave the people manna in the

desert, give us a sign so that we will know that you are from God. They are looking to identify a prophet without realizing that God is standing before them. Jesus corrects their misinterpretation, saying that the manna received by their ancestors came from God. As God fulfilled their ancestors' needs in the desert, so God has provided them with food for eternal life. In the bread that they have received from Jesus, they have received physical nourishment and also spiritual nourishment. Jesus wants the crowd to see beyond the surface to the One who provides true nourishment.



The conclusion of the dialogue reveals the crowd's blindness. They ask for what Jesus has just told them they have found: "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus answers plainly that he himself is the Bread of Life they seek. Jesus himself is the Bread of Life who will satisfy every hunger and thirst. This is the first of several such statements found in John's Gospel. We understand

these better when we remember that God revealed his name to the people of Israel as "I am," as Yahweh. Jesus is now claiming this name for himself. In the weeks ahead, we will see the offense that this gives to the people.



This weekend you will notice an assortment of vestments that the priests/deacon wear for Mass and other liturgical services placed near the pulpit. These were recently purchased for the parish through your generosity. We will bless them this weekend for sacred use. You are truly good, generous and wonderful parishioners. We are blessed beyond words here at St. Angela's. the goodness and mercy of God is multiplied in our hearts when we offer what we have to him. All Jesus asks of us is to have faith in him for he is truly the answer to every longing of our hearts.

What we think may be a meager offering can be transformed by the power of God into a force of healing and mercy beyond our comprehension.

Remember to mark **August 29<sup>th</sup> at the 9:30am Mass as we welcome Bishop Malesic to our parish.** Bishop will celebrate that Mass and then come to join us at our Welcome Back Parish Picnic. Let's provide him with a warm St. Angela's welcome!

These readings, and the theme of the Eucharist, that we will be delving into over the next few weeks reminds me of a beautiful prayer that has become a "go to" in my life. I pray that it helps you and yours as it has helped me appreciate the supreme gift of Jesus – The Bread of Life- in all of our lives.

**This past weekend we welcomed Reverend Zbigniew Pienkos C.Ss.R, a Redemptorist priest, to speak at all Masses for his missionary appeal.**

**We are proud to report that St. Angelas collected \$2,867 for this appeal.**

**Below is Fr. Pienkos' homily:**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,  
In 1908 the three Polish Redemptorists who were invited by the administrator of diocese of minsko-mohylewskaj with a head office in Petersburg, went to tsar's Russia in order to perform missions in the 10 largest Catholic Parishes located in Ural and Siberia. After receiving official licenses, credentials and visas from Petersburg by taking trans-Siberian railway, as well as sailboats of large Russian rivers they have visited: Czelabińsk, Ekaterinburg, Tobolsk, Omsk, Tomsk, Krasnojarsk, Irkuck, Czię, Harbin –which at that time was the part of Russia, and at present it is located on territory of China- and Władywostok.

When we read memoirs from this five-month trip we notice that those parishes were very big with approximately 3000 parishioners, mainly Polish origin. They were descendants of the exiles after the November and January Uprisings. They were very involved with the Church and participated in all services held during a mission. The parishes were thriving, and they were giving hope for the future. However, at that time nobody was aware that the visiting Catholics were standing on "the edge of a precipice" ...

They weren't even presuming that in ten years almost all the priests who hosted them will perish martyrdom for Faith; they weren't even thinking that many parishioners will be persecuted because of the Faith, and that all the churches in which they were praying would be destroyed and turned into different kinds of factories. Then I am sure You all know what happened after 1917, after the October Revolution-there was fight with God and Faith.

When first Polish Redemptorists came to Russia in 1994, he met Polish man, who with tears in his eyes told he this story. „I will never forget this, I was a little boy, when Russians deported the whole family to Kazachstan. We lived at that time in a village in which miraculously one of the Orthodox churches survived, so we have decided to participate in the liturgy there. One Sunday during the celebration of the Liturgy, Russian soldiers rode on the

horses into the Church. They took all the people outside the church together with the priest. They put the gun into his head and ordered him to say: "tell all of them that God doesn't exist, that all that you have taught them through all those years are lies and nonsense! If you don't do it, you will die! There was silence. We all were waiting for what the elder priest would say. All of a sudden, the silence stopped by the shout " God existed, exists and always will!" The shooting started, and in a few minutes the church with all the sacred objects was in flames. My Dear Brothers and Sisters. This is only one example showing the magnitude of martyrdom there. This soil is truly soaked with the blood of martyrs. Nowadays the situation is different. We pray so that the time of persecution and oppression would never come back again! After 70 years the „reconstruction/transformation/pieriestrojka" has begun and slightly opened the door allowing the priests to start the ministry on that territory. At that time the first priests came to the former Soviet Union and tried to find Catholics in order to rebuild the Communities and parishes. Polish Redemptorists also came to Russia and Kazachstan and today-after 26 years- we serve in 6 cities: in Syberia in Kemerowo, in Ural in Orenburg and Orsk, in Wolga in Togliatti, in Kazachstan in Pietropawlowsk and in Kaliningrad County in Pioniersk.

During the last 26 years with God's and human's help we have managed to achieve a lot. For example, we have gotten back and restored Catholic Church in Orenburg. It was built by exiles after the November Uprising. In 1847, it was consecrated and devoted to Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God. However, in the 30's of the twentieth century this church was turned into the shoe factory. The tower was destroyed, and they built two floors inside. The staircases connecting floors were located in the presbytery and vestibule of the church. They have replaced the windows with the square ones, and they have added additions in the front and at the side, so that nobody could notice that it used to be a church. Today this church is restored and in 1997 was consecrated. Every day we celebrate Eucharist there, and it is always full of the faithful.

We also built new churches in Pietropawlowsk, in Orsk, in Kemerowo, and at present we are building a new church named Blessed John Paul II. However, from the perspective of 26 years, we have to admit that it is sometimes much easier to rebuild or build a new church from the stone or brick than to build the spiritual one in humans' hearts!

Perhaps one more example. "John told how they were celebrating the Eucharist without the priest. They put the white tablecloth on the table. On this altar they also placed saved, priest's stole and they were reading aloud the words of the Mass until the words of consecration. When the words of the bread and wine were supposed to be said nobody dared to say them aloud. There was silence. They could only hear the cry as a deep grief of the people... Then someone from the gathered people continued with words: „That is the great Mystery of our Faith".

My dear Brothers and Sisters.



Through all these long years they were gathering on the prayer. This Faith did all the miracles! „It has moved the Mountains" Nowadays in the same city people can attend the Holy Mass in newly built church. However, the conditions in which we minister now are still completely different from those that you have here in this parish.

My dear!

We are thankful to You for your prayers and support, that you present to the mission. The Mission is the task for/of all of us. Everyone has its own role to fulfill. We are in the East engaged in the ministry and you here, through your prayers, sacrifice and

financial support can help us in the work of the Mission which the work of God. I want to thank all of you for your understanding, prayers and support. We will always keep you in our prayers. May God Bless You All.

Through this prayer, the people of God sanctify the day by continual praise of God and prayers of intercession for the needs of the world.

"'Nine Nights of Night Prayer' is a unique opportunity to open up nine of our beautiful churches in the evenings for an experience of beauty, community, Scripture and tradition," Father Ference added, noting that Pope Francis reminds us that prayer "appeases anger, sustains love, multiplies joy and instills the strength to forgive."


