



With less than a one-day supply of critical blood types in recent weeks, doctors have been forced to make difficult decisions about who receives blood transfusions and who will need to wait until more products become available. The Red Cross is working around the clock. While there is not an immediate need for additional blood drive locations, more blood donors are needed now. We need your help!

The event, organized by Erie's People for Life, Inc., marks the 49th anniversary of the 1973 Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court decision permitting abortion. Parking will be available in the parking garage on Peach Street between W. 7th and 8th streets, and in the lots just east of Perry Square on French Street.
