

Synodality Process

As shared at Mass last weekend, the synodal listening process at Holy Cross Parish needs your participation. If you are interested in sharing your thoughts regarding who we are to become as Church, then please prayerfully consider participating in one of the three series (three sessions each) being offered. The first series will be offered in-person Sunday mornings following the 9 a.m. Mass. The dates for this series will be February 13, February 27 and March 13 and will not conflict with Religious Education. Paul Desante will serve as facilitator.

The second series will be offered virtually on Wednesday evenings from 7-8:30 p.m. The dates for this series will be February 16, February 23 and March 9 and will be facilitated by Michael Bucell. A Zoom link will be provided for both virtual series.

The third series, facilitated by Cynthia Legin-Bucell will be offered virtually on Thursday early afternoons from 12 noon -1:30 p.m. The dates for this series will be February 17, February 24, and March 10.

Fish Dinners

The Lenten Fish Dinners will begin Friday, March 4. It will be Take-Out only again. Sign-up sheets will be posted on the board in the Gathering Space for set up and breading the

fish on Thursday night and to work the dinners on Friday.

The take-out process will be the same as last year.

We are still not permitted to have homemade desserts. Last year some parishioners generously donated trays of cookies and others donated money towards the purchase of the cookies from Sam's Club as dessert for the dinners. If anyone would like to donate a tray or donate monetarily towards a tray, you can drop the cookies off any time before the dinners or drop the money at the office or in the offertory basket in an envelope marked Fish Dinner Cookies. A tray is made up of 7 dozen cookies and right now are priced at \$19.98 at Sam's Club.

Synod: Key Term #2 What is synodality?

The Church has been holding synods since ancient times. While the concept of synodality is old, the word "synodality" is very new. It means the entire People of God assembling together, journeying together, and actively participating in the evangelizing mission of the Church. Pope Francis is calling us to recognize synodality as the way the entire Church operates. Everyone is involved, everyone contributes. In particular, it means listening to each other and not remaining oblivious in our own bubbles. Synodality is not only for internal affairs, but also manifests the Church's universal and missionary nature to the world. Hopefully this Synod on Synodality will help us to better understand and live out this emerging concept.

What is the Synod on Synodality?

Pope Francis has asked the entire world to participate in a synod on the topic "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission." The central question he asks of everyone is: A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, "journeys together." How is this "journeying together" happening today in our diocese? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our "journeying together"? You may be invited to participate in listening sessions at your local parish, or you may wish to give your input online. Participation in a synod should always involve prayer, listening, discussion, and above all, discerning the way that the Holy Spirit is guiding us. Hopefully these questions and answers can help you as you prepare your input.
