Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

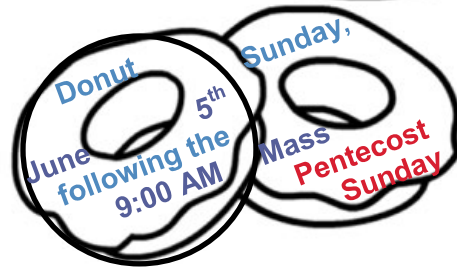
The Collection for International Needs provides us with the opportunity to broaden our charitable horizons by reaching out to our brothers and sisters in need throughout the world.

Pulling Out All the Stops

We are likely familiar with the expression “pull out all the stops.” It implies that we should do everything possible, to make an experience or pursuit of a particular goal as full and complete as possible. And, if there’s ever a time to liturgically pull out all the stops, It’s Easter!

Did you know the phrase has origins in sacred music? An organ has several ranks of pipes, typically, each of which makes a different sort of sound: flutes, reeds, strings, etc. And, at the organ console, the organist decides on a registration for each piece – that is, which combinations of ranks are used to create the desired sound. So, an organist who pulls out all the stops is literally making the organ play as forcefully and as fully as possible. May our celebrations of resurrection and new life be strong and full as well!
