



EASTER TRIDUUM – The *Easter Triduum* celebrates the core of our faith – the Paschal Mystery – the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ for our salvation. This Easter celebration begins with the *Mass of the Last Supper* and ends with *Evening Praise* (Vespers) on Easter Sunday. It is one, unified celebration of our core belief in who Jesus is, what Christ has done for us and what Christ calls us to live in our own lives.

PASCHAL FAST – The Constitution on Sacred Liturgy (#110) reminds us to "keep sacred, the Paschal Fast . . . as a way of coming to the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection with uplifted and welcoming heart."

What is the *Paschal Fast* and what makes it different from any other fast? The fasting of Lent is **penitential**, an act of repenting for our sin. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, it ends during the afternoon of Holy Thursday. As we enter the Easter Triduum with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we focus on what it means to be at the Easter Vigil. The fasting of Friday and Saturday is not penitential, but **anticipatory**. Such fasting is not only from food. Even more important may be the fasting from our normal work, fasting from seeking ways to be entertained or our cultural hunger for diversion. Catholics are called to live these days unlike any other of the year – and this is so— whatever our work, whatever our family situation or educational background. It is a great leveler, like the Eucharist itself – this *Paschal fast*.

Easter Flowers

In the packet of church envelopes is one marked Easter Offering for Flowers, Art, Environment. The offering from this envelope is used to purchase flowers and other pieces to enhance our liturgical environment for the Easter season. Please consider returning the envelope as soon as possible. It is a special way you can honor the memory of a loved one you have lost.



Blessing of the faster Baskets

In Slavic countries the blessing of Easter foods was an important tradition. This blessing is still found in the updated Roman Ritual, and is a wonderful practice which is still maintained by many Slavic & Polish-American families. The food items in the święconka (shvyehn-SOHN-kah), or Easter basket (the term also refers to the Easter Sunday breakfast at which the blessed food is eaten), have special significance. The basket is lined with an embroidered cloth or traditional folk fabric. The filled basket is covered with a white linen cloth (some have a colorful crocheted edging or embroidered design), representing the shroud of Christ. A typical basket would include symbolic foods like these: bacon, bread, Easter bread, butter (often shaped into a lamb), candle (which can be lit during the blessing by the priest), cheese, colored eggs, ham, sausage (kiełbasa), horseradish, salt, and sweets. Fr. Tom will bless Easter Baskets Saturday morning at 10:00 AM in the Gathering Space by the west entrance.


