# FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

Dear Friends,

I write this note to you today as your Temple staff and clergy prepare for the most exciting event of the past fifteen months – The Temple-community regathering. Since the start of the pandemic, the focus of our efforts has been (and will remain) to promote the health and safety of all members of our congregational family. Yet, given current trends and with medical advice and support, we recently concluded that it is possible for us to both be safe and start to congregate at the same time. The excitement among us is palpable. Yes, many of our Ganon Gil children, teachers, and staff members have been a source of joy in our Temple facility throughout the past months. Yes, we have celebrated and officiated life-cycle events with a small number of participants. Yes, we have communicated through screens and telephones, and sometimes on driveways and parking lots. Yes, we have kept in touch and so deeply appreciated the strength and resilience of this wonderful community. However, the prospects of face-to-face prayer services with you, of in-person engagement and conversation in learning, of interactions in our café, in our commons, in meetings, and in a variety of programs – the prospect of seeing you in person at the Temple, starting gradually, both indoors and outdoors, is becoming increasingly real with every day that goes by. It is a source of renewed energy and joy for all of us.



We think of this regathering in different ways. At times, we envision a “return to normal” or a return to “what it was like.” Significant disruptions in our personal and collective lives often entail a wish to “return” to the known, comfortable, and familiar. Following the fall of Judah and the exile of its people, the biblical poet gave expression to this yearning, calling upon God to “direct our return like the dry riverbeds and channels of the desert” (Psalms 126:4). In other words, as these riverbeds have always collected and directed water to its natural destination in the desert, so should our movement be directed “home” in a “natural flow,” in the way water had flowed through the desert from time immemorial. In this respect the exile, the “separation,” presents itself as an obstacle to our natural movement and flow, and our return – a resumption of the natural order.

On the other hand, we also recognize that return does not offer a nostalgic or romantic, magical solution to all our problems, but an embrace of old and new hopes and challenges. Thus, the poet writes, “Let the carrier of the seed-bag walk out and weep; Let the carrier of sheaves walk in with joyous song” (verse 6). The poet knows: the carrier of seed who seeks to fertilize the field will yet again experience anxiety that the toil and investment in the field and in the seeds will not yield the anticipated produce. Yet the prayer we utter is that the effort we make and tears we shed will turn to satisfaction, fulfillment, gratitude, and celebration in the reaping of our harvest. For the seeds to grow and produce, much has to take place and in the right order. The farmer is merely able to control and anticipate certain elements of the agricultural process; we rely on nature, we require resources and conditions that are beyond our control. We cannot promise the consistent success of our efforts, nor the disappearance of challenge and concern. We wish for the opportunity to return to our field, together, to hold hands, cry, muster our courage, and pray as we sow seeds in anticipation. We wish to celebrate our harvest together.

Finally, we recognize that there is a dream-like quality to any significant return. To the exiles, the return of individual Judeans or families would be very difficult but perhaps not entirely impossible. Yet the difference between the return of individuals, families, and eventually communities, and the resumption of national sovereignty and a collective redemption of the Judean mission in the world was vast and daunting. The regathering or return the poet imagined seemed to many beyond reach. Psalm 126 opens with the words “When the Source of Life conducts the return of Zion, we will be like dreamers” (verse 1), reminding us to always bear in mind the greater purpose and mission of our regathering and return. Let us return to a Temple of prayer and reflection, support and compassion, learning and growth, and the advancement of justice and hope for us and for members of our greater community. Let us rejoice and be glad in the opportunity to see each other. Let us recommit to the legacy and mission of our extraordinary community. Let us be like dreamers.
