Lent – The 1-1-1 Plan: Well, it's only been 4 or 5 days into Lent – are you sticking to the plan? If you are having troubles, I have a help: please take home a magnate for your refrigerator depicting the plan. Let it be a daily


reminder to your personal commitment toward your Lenten discipline. Follow the plan, and your Easter celebration will be that much more meaningful to you.

Weekly Adoration: Blessed Carlos Acutis, a 15 year old boy in love with Jesus in the Eucharist, once said: "When you put yourself before the sun, you get a sun tan. When you put yourself before the Eucharist in Adoration, you get holy." Come bask in the Light of Christ sometime during our 24 hour Adoration from Wed, 8:00pm to Thur, 8:00pm at SA or on Sat, 11:00am to noon at FX and allow yourselves to experience

Weekly Stations of the Cross: Please make a concerted effort this Lent to attend our weekly Stations of the cross on Fridays at 1:45 with our school children at FX, or at 7:00pm alternating between our two parishes - this week it is at FX. Please come as a family as well. I first expose the Blessed Sacrament, we pray the Stations together, and then end with Benediction. I will also offer the opportunity for Confessions following the service.

Our Lenten Penance Service is set for Tuesday, March 22 at 7:00pm at FX. This will be our only service for Lent.

The Gift of Life: The American Red Cross will be at SA hall this Thurs, Mar. 10. Just as Our Lord poured out His Blood for our salvation, we have the opportunity to offer at least a pint for the lives of others.

Seven Last Words from the Cross


2. "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." (Lk 23:43)

CH 4 - THE PATH TO COMMUNION

The priesthood as a sign of unity 39. "As a member of a particular Church, each priest must be a sign of communion with the Bishop, since he is his immediate collaborator, in union with his brothers in the priesthood. With pas-

toral charity, he exercises his ministry, chiefly in the community entrusted to him, and he leads his community to encounter Christ the Good Shepherd. His vocation requires him to be a sign of unity. Therefore, he must avoid any involvement in party politics, since this would divide the community". The Synod Fathers call for "a pastoral plan for diocesan clergy, to strengthen their spirituality and their sense of mission and identity, centered on following Christ, the eternal High Priest, always striving to obey the Father's will. Christ is the model of generous dedication, of austerity of life and of service even unto death. The priest should be conscious of the fact that, by virtue of the Sacrament of Orders, he is the bearer of grace, which he communicates to his brothers and sisters in the sacraments. He himself is sanctified in the exercise of his ministry".

The field in which priests work is vast. Therefore, they should concentrate on what is essential to their ministry: "letting themselves be configured to Christ the Head and Shepherd, the source of all pastoral charity, offering themselves each day with Christ in the Eucharist, in order to help the faithful both personally and communally to experience the living Jesus Christ". As witnesses and disciples of the merciful Christ, they are called to be instruments of forgiveness and reconciliation, putting themselves generously at the service of the faithful in the spirit of the Gospel.

As pastors of the People of God in America, priests must also be alert to the challenges of the world today and sensitive to the problems and hopes of their people, sharing their experiences and growing, above all, in solidarity towards the poor. They should be careful to discern the charisms and strengths of the faithful who might be leaders in the community, listening to them and through dialogue encouraging their participation and co-responsibility. This will lead to a better distribution of tasks, enabling priests "to dedicate themselves to what is most closely tied to the encounter with and the proclamation of Jesus Christ, and thus to represent better within the community the presence of Jesus who draws his people together".

The task of discerning charisms also includes knowing how best to use those priests who show an aptitude for special ministries. Moreover, every priest is expected to offer his fraternal help to other priests and to turn trustingly to them in time of need.



Fatima Message on Devotion of the Five First Saturdays:

With the intention of making reparation.

All of the conditions mentioned earlier, namely, Communions of reparation, Confession, 15 minutes of meditation on the mysteries of the Rosary, should be fulfilled with the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. On the occasion of the visit of the Child Jesus to Sr. Lucia (Feb. 16, 1926), she asked: "My Jesus, what about those who forget to make the intention?" Jesus answered: "They can do so at their next confession, taking advantage of their first opportunity to go to Confession."

The above are the minimum requirements for fulfilling the conditions of Our Lady's promise to obtain for us "at the hour of death the graces necessary for salvation." Yet, these Communions of reparation, as has been pointed out, are only a portion of the devotion of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These few instructions are meant to

help bring about a frame of mind and heart that will make us aware of the need of reparation all through the month, and not just on the first Saturday.

[NB: In honor of our year of Spiritual Renewal, I'll offer a 9am Mass at FX on the first Saturdays of June through October to provide for this request of Our Lady of Fatima.]
