Second Sunday of Advent

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This week we celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8. The Bishops of the United States proclaimed Mary, under the title of her Immaculate Conception, the patroness of the United States in 1846. Since this is our national feast day, it is usually a Holy Day of Obligation. However, since all Sunday and Holy Day obligations are currently dispensed by our bishop, it is not a day of obligation this year. We will, however, still have three Masses for the feast day if you would like to attend.

The Immaculate Conception is a spiritual miracle. Since the sin of Adam and Eve, all human beings have been conceived in a state of original sin, which is a state of alienation from God. Note that original sin is not an "actual sin"; it is not a sin that is formally cooperated with after a reasonable deliberation. Catholics do not believe that infant babies are capable of sinning. It is, rather, a condition or a state of being. Through the cross, Jesus has made salvation possible and available to us. We normally receive this grace, called sanctifying grace, through the sacrament of Baptism. So, just as a baby can be born in original sin, so can a baby be born again through water and the spirit.

Mary, however, was different. God gave her a special grace. She was preserved from all sin, even original sin. This is why her conception is called "immaculate". It was not tainted even by the smallest stain of sin. The word "macula" means spot or stain. Perhaps you've heard of "macular degeneration" which is a form of eyesight disability common in the elderly. This happens when the macula, which is the spot in the back of the eye where light is focused, begins to break down. If you look at the back of the eye with special equipment, the macular appears as a "spot"; that's where it got its name. Mary has no spot on her soul. She is morally perfect.

We also believe that Mary never sinned in her entire life. Thus, when she died, she was assumed into heaven, body and soul. She was ready at that moment to be fully with God forever.

The dogma of the Immaculate Conception is important to Catholics because it safeguards our belief in Jesus as the Son of God. God, who is perfect, is given the perfect vessel for His entry into the world. Note that living a life without sin required Mary's cooperation. She had to say "yes" in her life to God and reject sin just like the rest of us.



(Fr. Recker's letter Continued)

How could Mary be preserved from Original Sin when Jesus wasn't even born yet? It is possible only through the cross. Jesus alone saves. Mary did not save herself from sin but received the graces of the cross even before Jesus was born (many years before!). Only God can apply graces as such, as He is outside of time seeing all time at once. We call this "proleptic" as the grace was applied before the sacrifice of Christ on the cross.

Advent is a great time to consider these beautiful mysteries of our faith. Mary is the Immaculate Conception. She is all pure. She acts with pure love and continues to intercede with pure love on our behalf. I found a nice Advent poem that reflects on these truths:

December by J.A.M.

Upreads the sun at morning's birth,
In glory bathes the wood and plain;
Day's busy hum awakes the earth
To view the scene of Winter's reign.
We love the smile of youthful Spring,
There's gladness in the Summer's glow,
And rich in Autumn's harvesting,--
Yet, greater gifts can Winter show,--
Rare gifts, surpassing pearls and gold;
God's Mother-Maid, Immaculate,
And Christ the King--these, Winter old
Brings down to bless man's poor estate


