**The Holy Family**

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Merry Christmas! With Christmas falling on a Friday this year we move almost immediately into the celebration of Sunday. The first Sunday after Christmas is always the Feast of the Holy Family. This feast takes on special significance this year as Pope Francis has just declared a Holy Year dedicated to St. Joseph.

In the chapel of our new rectory there is a print of a portrait of St. Joseph above the altar. I love this image of St. Joseph because he is cradling the child Jesus in his arms. Mary and Joseph are the perfect parents for the child Jesus. I imagine they had all the struggles of new parents with a new infant. But then as Jesus grew, they likely also noticed how different He was from other children. We know that when He was accidentally left in the Temple at the age of 12, His response to His parents when He was found was rather unusual: "Don't you know that I must be in my Father's house?"

Jesus is leading them gently to understand that He must always be first about the business of His heavenly Father. Imagine being the guardians of the Son of God. How do you do this effectively? The humility of St. Joseph and the Blessed Mother is the perfect match for their role in His life. The first goal of their lives is holiness; therefore, God can easily guide them in their daily tasks in raising the Son of God to maturity.

The family is the domestic Church. In our time, the faith is passed down primarily through families. If the faith is lived out in the home, there is a much greater chance that the faith will be lived out in the lives of the children. While there will likely still be a questioning of the faith as the children grow into adulthood, the seed of the faith will always remain in their hearts.

It is essential that families pray together and that they attend holy Mass together. I was blessed to grow up in a family that went to Mass together every Sunday. We always went to the 8:00 Mass together and then had breakfast together at home. We would often stop to get a dozen donuts and a Sunday edition of the Blade on the way home (we only lived two blocks from the church). Sunday breakfasts were always special and delicious. Even after I left home, I wanted these Sunday mornings and did my best to keep the tradition alive in my life. Of course, as a priest, Sunday mornings do not allow for such things for me anymore, but the spirit of Sunday is very much alive in my heart every weekend. I love seeing families together at Mass. Even if the children yell out during my homily or demand a bathroom break (even if I have a short homily!), the joy

of seeing families far outweighs any disruptive annoyance. I once heard a Cardinal Archbishop give a talk in which he said that the cry of child in Church is more eloquent a message than any homily given by a priest or bishop. While we priests may try to get a message across; a child simply lives the message by being present in Church with their family. Their presence is a message of the dedication and love of their parents, who are willing to forgo the convenience of a Sunday morning at home for the spiritual good of their sons and daughters. It is a message of sacrificial love.

Christmas is often a difficult holiday as we grow older. My Dad passed away on Christmas Eve in 2006, so it is often a bittersweet celebration for my family. I'll never forget how our celebration that year was more than a little subdued. Christmas carols bring back a little bit of the magic of Christmas, but it really will never be quite the same without Dad. But that is really the point. Jesus came to save us from the power of sin and death. Our celebration of Christmas is not only a celebration of His birth but also of His continued presence in our lives. This presence will reach its apex in the next life. The cherished memories of past Christmases are nothing compared to what is to come. If there is sadness at Christmas, there is also a hope that we will all be together again rejoicing in the full presence of God.

## GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

### The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Tragedy and disappointment are inevitable. What sees you through this? There will be challenges, changes, unexpected circumstances, interrupted plans, hurts, and injustices experienced by every human being at some point in their lives. We will be asked to adjust our plans, change course, and even encounter suffering and death. Where do we learn all of the lessons we need to live life well? Some of them we learn along the way but much of what we bring to life, positive and negative, comes from our early beginnings, our families. This is our early world and provides the blueprint for how we see the bigger, more inclusive world, which unfolds before us.

Our families of origin can be sources of grace, heartache or a combination of both. Families are intended to be pivotal in providing us with proper social structure and understanding, a support system, lessons about relationships and communication, and the unconditional acceptance and love we so desperately crave. They can also determine whether we have an accessible and healthy relationship with God. Many of life's challenges can literally bring us to our knees and require that we possess a strength of character that resides well beyond the superficialities of our world. At some point we will all need three coping gifts that can be given to us only by God: faith, hope, and love. Our families help us learn that we are not the ones responsible for their creation, but God!

Our experience of early family life colors all of our relationships and what we expect to achieve from life in general. Resolving conflicts, dealing with difficulty and suffering, celebrating accomplishments, prioritizing our needs, listening to God's call, understanding relationships, understanding disappointment, learning about the virtues and living a centered focused life are all lessons our families either succeed in teaching or do not. To succeed, as God has designed and ordered our world, is to discover his presence and then trust that Presence. The Holy Family can teach even the most dysfunctional family how to best use God's gifts of faith, hope, and love to find him and do his will. 
