Pentecost Sunday**

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Happy Pentecost! Today we celebrate the birthday of the Church, as the Holy Spirit descends upon the Apostles and empowers them to preach the Gospel and bring the saving power of the Cross to the world. Thus, the plan of salvation continues in the Church, which is the Body of Christ. We continue this mission today by our own baptisms and by being faithful to Jesus Christ. The sacraments are the foundational methods for us to remain connected to the vine of Jesus Christ. How blessed we are to have His grace so readily present to us and available for our spiritual nourishment.

As I spoke of last week at our weekend Masses, Bishop Thomas recently decided to restore Masses and liturgies without restrictions beginning the weekend of June 5-6. This also happens to be the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). I find that to be providential, as this great Mystery of our faith leads us back to our normal routine of Sunday Mass attendance.

It is important to note that with this restoration, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation is restored. As was previously the case before the pandemic, all of the faithful have a serious obligation to attend Mass every Sunday and also on Holy Days of Obligation (the next Holy Day of Obligation, the Feast of the Assumption, happens to fall on a Sunday this year). Some parishioners have already commented to me that they never realized that the obligation had been lifted, as they have attended Mass for the past year after public Masses were reinstated last May. Bishop Thomas had issued a dispensation from the obligation since the pandemic reached our area in March of 2020.

There has been some confusion in regard to the Sunday obligation in recent years. Sunday is the day of the resurrection, and, as such, is the day in which we as Christians keep the precept to keep holy the Sabbath Day (which for Jews is Saturday). There is no explicit divine commandment that we attend Mass on Sunday. We do know that the Sunday Eucharist was practiced in the Apostolic period as it is mentioned in St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians and also in the Acts of the Apostles. Early documents from the first and second centuries also attest to the Eucharist celebrated on Sundays. As such, there has been a Church precept (rule) that the faithful have the obligation to attend Sunday Mass for centuries (this obligation is outlined clearly in Canon Law). Note that the Church has the authority to bind us in conscience to attend Sunday Mass. This is a *serious* obligation. In other words, intentionally breaking this precept is grave matter, capable of being a mortal sin. As your pastor, it is my duty to inform you of the seriousness of this obligation which we all have as Catholics.

(Fr. Recker's letter Continued)

We live in an age where most people place their personal opinions above the authority of others. It is not surprising, therefore, that fewer and fewer Catholics take seriously the Sunday obligation. For this reason, many attempts have been made over the past couple of decades to bring Catholics back to the practice of Sunday Mass attendance. The results have not been fruitful. I know priests who prefer to refer to the "obligation" as an "opportunity". I understand the desire to put a positive spin on what would otherwise appear to be a burden. However, such language downplays the reality of the situation. When we are baptized, we are spiritually under the authority of our bishop; this is a real thing. Jesus regularly counseled His disciples to submit to the authority of the religious leaders of their time. When those authorities acted in ways that were not in line with virtue, He counseled them to do what they say, but not to do what they do. In other words, as long as their commands did not contradict with the dictates of conscience, they were morally bound to submit to these authorities. It is clear that God fully respects authority and will judge us according to how we honor the authority of our spiritual leaders.

With that being said, it is important to highlight the great gift of the Sunday Mass to us. Receiving the Holy Eucharist regularly is vital to us in our life of faith. The Eucharist is the pearl of great price, of which we place first in our lives, because it is Jesus Himself. Negligence of the sacraments is negligence of Jesus Christ. The truth is that we cannot be holy without the grace of God. We rely fully on His grace. We cannot get to heaven on our own, and we cannot be holy without being in communion with God.

As your pastor, I understand that some people will be reticent to return to Mass. If you have a serious health condition that would put your life in danger, you can easily be dispensed from Sunday Mass attendance. For the great majority of us, however, this obligation binds us spiritually. I look forward to a return to some sense of normalcy. I pray that we as a parish will thrive with the restoration of normative sacramental practices. God bless you,


GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Pentecost Sunday

Begin by taking a moment to calm yourself, focus on your breathing and become aware of the life force that flows through your veins. Center yourself in the words and affections of St. Augustine's Prayer to the Holy Spirit, "Breath in me, O Holy Spirit, that my thoughts may all be holy. Act in me, O Holy Spirit, that my work, too, may be holy. Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit, that I love but what is holy. Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit, to defend all that is holy. Guard me, then, O Holy Spirit, that I may always be holy." Sanctifying, bringing things to wholeness, blessing, restoring and creating are just some of the fruits of the presence of the Holy Spirit. Being filled with the Holy Spirit is not always about proclaiming loud cries of praise or singing alleluia from a roof top. It is about unfolding and encountering the ordinary in an extraordinary way. Being filled with the Holy Spirit means being filled with the fullness of God's life and in touch with the power and wonder of God's presence. It's about becoming holy.

It is not just for saints or people who have a religious vocation. Holiness is for the ordinary, simple run-of-the-mill person who desires to love God, others, and all of creation. When an ordinary, humble person becomes connected with life and the wondrous power of God's love, they begin to live life more deeply, a bit more reverently, desire a simple fare and find themselves relishing in ordinary beauty. Their senses become attuned to the Author of life and they realize that they are not alone. The Holy Spirit connects all of the dots of human experience and existence, bringing everyone to center on the Divine Presence. The Holy Spirit does not just breathe "on me" but "in me" and is the force behind every breath I take. Take a moment to soak that thought in. There is the Divine Presence of the Holy Spirit in me, right now. When a person becomes in touch with truth, they know that when inspired by the Holy Spirit, his or her actions are not solely their own. They realize that they are moved by Divine Grace and drawn to things not found in secular affairs.

We live in a world where it is hard to discover truth. Real truth is veiled by so many imposters that it is hard to find, especially for those who are young. It is easy to get fooled and duped and often, without full conscious awareness of doing so, we choose to walk down a path of self-absorption and destruction. It is only the Holy Spirit, through the ministry of the church most especially, who guides us to truth and shows us the way to be the graced and holy human beings God made us to be. The wonders and inspirations of today's Feast of Pentecost are necessary to share with both those we love and those who only casually cross our paths. The first disciples, touched by the Holy Spirit, brought the Gospel to the ends of the earth one step at a time. Is it unrealistic to ask that we assist in that same mission by helping people understand who they are and who God is one at a time? Ask the Holy Spirit to alleviate the fear in your heart that prevents you from doing so. ©LPI



SAFE ENVIRONMENT COMPLIANCE AUDIT


The Diocese of Toledo remains committed to ensuring the protection of children and providing a safe environment for all young people. If you have any knowledge of abuse that has been committed by a cleric or by any personnel of the Catholic Church, you are urged to report the abuse to your local police department, Children Services, and to contact the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at (419) 214-4880; or to write to the Victim Assistance Coordinator at 1933 Spielbusch Avenue; Toledo, Ohio 43604.

In order to ensure that everyone is aware of how to report an allegation of sexual abuse by church personnel, each parish and school is to publish some form of notice on this process approximately 4-6 times a year, and announce it publicly at least once a year, *Charter, Article 2*. These notices (in various formats) will periodically be placed in *Nuntius* for your use and are readily available on the diocesan website under Protecting Youth/Victim Assistance, Compliance Audit.

Those of us in ministry love this saying: God doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called.




