



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We celebrate the feast of Christ the King today, the last Sunday in Ordinary Time. In our American culture the concept of a King is outside of our everyday experience. In American politics, to be called a king is an insult; we find it distasteful for someone to claim to have ultimate authority, as personal independence and freedom are seen as paramount. We equate a king with tyranny. Jesus is the answer to any hesitance we might have with a concept of a king. He is all good and all loving. While in us mere men and women, absolute power inevitably leads to absolute corruption, this is not the case for Jesus the King. He will always respect our freedom; however, He does have absolute and universal sovereignty. Only God determines what is right and wrong, and only God can truly judge the human heart, understanding within it the complex mix of actions and intentions. Our role, then, is to acknowledge His supreme authority, to worship Him, and to follow Him. Rather than leading to tyranny, the reign of Christ leads to true freedom and peace.

Today's Gospel reveals a scene from the Passion of Jesus which is full of dramatic irony. As we read it, we know that Jesus is the Son of God and King of the Universe, while Pilate is simply a Roman governor, sent by Caesar to maintain peace in Jerusalem. Jesus of course has all authority, yet is being examined by a seeming superior, one who has power to have Him killed. Pilate simply asks the obvious question in regard to the charges brought forward against Jesus, "Are you the King of the Jews?" The response of Jesus is clear to those who have faith in Him although puzzling to Pilate: "My kingdom does not belong to this world...I came into the world to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." Note that Jesus does not deny that He is a king. Rather, He points to the reality of His kingship. Jesus testifies to the truth and seeks to lead others to the truth. He doesn't do this with the help of armies and weapons, but with the incisive power of truth itself. Ultimately, when we examine ourselves and the world, we realize that there can only be one definitive king, the truth of God; this is true for all times, for all places, and for all peoples.

This week, as we gather to celebrate Thanksgiving Day, give thanks for the gift of our faith. We are blessed to live in the times in which we live. While this year has remained to be difficult in light of the pandemic, we are blessed with so many gifts. We still maintain our freedoms in a country dedicated to liberty and justice. As a nation, we are not at war; we are blessed to have peace in our land. We have once again had a bountiful harvest; no American family should go hungry. We have access to incredible knowledge at our fingertips and our technology has allowed us to live very comfortably.

God has been good to us. Let us never take these things for granted, but work to preserve them and also thank God for them. May God continue to grant His abundant graces upon our nation and our families. May we continue to live in peace. And may we never forget His love. Thanks be to God. Thanks be to Jesus. Amen.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

We often come to life expecting all of the pieces of the puzzle to nicely fit together. We want and expect harmony, order, and fairness, the achievement of rewards for good behavior, good health, and happiness. We can more easily accept death when it comes naturally after a good long life, but have a real difficulty comprehending the meaning of it all when it is cut short. Willing to put in a good measure of effort, we desire positive results. When things go wrong and life gets hurtful, unjust, and downright ugly, we become unsettled and can quickly fall into despair. This is especially true if we are people of faith who believe in a God who sees things on our terms and works in favor of our life agenda. What happens to our faith when we find ourselves sitting in a mess?

Does it help to know that God understands and that hardship, failure, disappointment, injustice, confusion, and all of life's ugliness do not make faith irrelevant or irrational? God is wonderfully and surprising creative! He turns the tables on not only our understanding of life, but of what it means to be a king. God sends us a king who is not exempt from life's ills but embraces them. The king that God gives to us knows what it means to be poor, suffer insults, be ridiculed, face rejection, endure suffering, be betrayed, and face a most unjust and horrific death. This is our king. Jesus is not a king of prestige or grandeur but a king who brings light to darkness, hope to despair, sinners to mercy, and new life out of death. Christ dances before us pleading with us to hold on, cling to love, avoid being negative, stop feeling cheated, and be strong in faith! There may be hardship and disappointment now but there are more surprises to come.

Once we understand this truth, we will also understand that we are on a most incredible and awesome universal journey to Christ and becoming one in Christ. We all carry within us the image of God, the image of our suffering king. The One who lives in us also lives in all of our brothers and sisters. Failing to see this universal Divine Presence in all is one of the greatest mistakes we can make, for we also fail to see God, our king, as well. There are many things that can bring hardship to life. If we keep our head about us and do not lose hope, we can persevere and strive for the greatest degree of justice possible. Even though there are ample things that can challenge our faith, we also know that our deepest joy comes from union with God and our brothers and sisters. One day, the fullness of that joy will be ours to have when we are all eternally one with Christ our King forever. ©LPI


