

NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

How to Overcome Fear... and Replace it with Courage!!

“Trust Me!” I was standing on the edge of the teacher’s desk and a new girl, Caroline Callahan, was conducting an exercise in trust and overcoming fear of the uncontrollable situations. She was a tough cookie, if you will, but she was going to be my lab partner and new homework guru, so I was taking a step on the wild side and was a willing participant in the exercise. With only the balls of my feet on the desk, and my back to my classmates, I closed my eyes... made a good act of contrition and leaned back and free fell into the arms of my classmates! The fall seemed to take forever but the landing was soft and comforting when the “arms” of my peers lowered me to safety.

This exercise was popular in the 70’s and, in my estimation, paid off for me for now I knew I could trust them and Caroline who helped my science grade sky rocket that year!

Stepping out of our comfort zone and into the arms/trust of others allows you to evaluate how fear will or will not possess you on your journey through life. Fear is only real when there is no other alternative to choose. Fear of loss of a job is real when you are cleaning out your desk but fear should not seep into the hope of what comes next! Suicide is on the rise in our country because many people lack **Trust** in family, friends or their own fortitude to just free fall into the next stage of their lives, knowing that it will be life changing but not deadly in most cases. If it doesn’t kill you it will make you stronger!

Trusting friends to catch you in a moronic stunt, like free-falling off a three foot desk, is less dangerous than stepping out of the comfort zone of human nature into the loving arms of Christ who promises us that even if it kills you, you will live forever in my truth and love!! But preserving your human life by clinging onto passing things will never make you stronger only more fearful to the change that is evident.

Courage is not some desire that “brave” people conjure up from deep inside themselves to conquer all adversities but it is a gift of the Holy Spirit. Courage is the fortitude to accept what you can not change and pursue what is attainable in God. Courage conquers fear because there is no place for fear in the presence of the Lord! Fear is a human substitute for peace that paralyzes our progress on the journey of perfection.

The apostles had become comfortable with the safety of Jesus tending to their needs and the needs of everyone they met. Jesus spoke and preached about an eternal kingdom that would be won through His death and resurrection but sharing in such a campaign as a willing participant was still beyond their pay grade. One day, amidst the storm on the Sea of Galilee, they became very afraid only to find Jesus asleep in the boat and when they called out in fear of their demise, He calmed the seas and their fears. They marveled at His power and wallowed in embarrassment that they did not courageously trust in Him.

“Where is your Faith” Jesus asked?

Faith is overshadowed by fear! Courage is the gift that bridges self-perseverance and abandonment in Christ!!

I can only imagine that Simon Peter made up his mind that the next time he would step out in courage, focused on the Lord, and leave his fears behind. I mean after all.... He was the “rock” and stability of Jesus’ mission depended on His leadership! He would get that chance to free fall into the love of Jesus and would be rewarded for his desire and challenge further in courage rather than fear.



Fear to Courage

Remember fear is a human emotion of self-preservation. Courage is an act of leaving behind our mortal concerns and desiring the immortal promise of Christ. This progression in faith begins with a vision that sees more perfectly the two natures of Jesus. When we have eyes for Jesus as the beloved son of the Father who came to live like us we imagine Him always interacting within our broken nature making it more perfect. However, when we desire to encounter the Divine nature of Jesus, that gives us a glimpse into the perfection of heaven we hesitate to follow! In the Transfiguration of Jesus, Peter, James and John were overwhelmed with His glory and wanted to “stay” there forever. Jesus’ transfiguration was a glimpse of perfection that could only come with personal transformation. The denying of oneself... to pick up the cross of courage and follow Him into the deep.

The Walking on the Water



Then He made the disciples get into the boat and precede Him to the other side, while He dismissed the crowds.

After doing so, He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray. When it was evening He was there alone.

Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it.

During the fourth watch of the night, He came toward them, walking on the sea.

When the disciples saw Him walking on the sea they were terrified. “It is a ghost,” they said, and they cried out in fear. At once [Jesus] spoke to them, “Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid.” Peter said to him in reply, “Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.”

He said, “Come.” Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how [strong] the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, “Lord, save me!” Immediately Jesus

stretched out his hand and caught him, and said to him, “O you of little faith, why did you doubt?” After they got into the boat, the wind died down.

Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying, “Truly, you are the Son of God.”

Peter decided not to see Jesus as a ghost and unattainable but the Lord and Christ that calmed the sea and his fears. Peter no longer wanted to stay in the safety of the boat that kept his “real fears” at bay but wanted to step out in courageous trust to become a “fisher of men.” Weak in the flesh his fears could no longer hold him back from becoming strong in the promise of perfection beyond this world and its clingy desire for complacency.

Peter asked to be commanded to come out onto the water knowing that Jesus speaks all command with love and truth.

He was the first to take the insidious step into the trust of a friend, not from a desk, into the raging waters of the sea!

He could walk on the water as long as his vision was on Christ. He only sank when he allowed those old fears to consume him. He was rescued when he remembered that Christ could save him from fear and death and in turn give him courage and trust.

There is No Such Thing as Instant Conversion over Fear!

Fear is the greatest temptation of Satan, to paralyze us into desiring our mortal lives rather than immortal lives in heaven. Just like Peter we must take that first step over our fear by trusting in Christ. The peace that comes will be the reason we will continue to take the next step until we desire only one thing Christ! Our fear is a reminder that bravery lends to courage through prayer: “Jesus save me!” He will and you will step out again and again in the face of your fear and ultimately the prayer will be “Jesus I Trust in you” for you know He has saved you over and over again.

What are we afraid of is death and life-eternal only comes through death as a passage of hope through courage.

Death of life as we know it; death to our comfort and freedom; death to our importance in the work-place; death to our role in the lives of children; death to friendships and health.... These are all real fears and real deaths but they are just a practice for the death of our mortal life and which is evident and can only be conquered in the promise that if we step out into Christ we will step into His perfection forever!!


