IN HIS GLORY: "LOVE ONE ANOTHER"

Last Sunday, in my homily, I focused on keeping God's Commandment of love based on the Risen Christ. Saint John tells us unless we know (the risen) Jesus we cannot keep His commandment of selfless love. John is very stern and calls those who do not keep Jesus' commandment of love while professing to "know" Him LIARS! So first we must "know" the Risen Lord as the one who calls us to a new life (eternal) in Him. To understand fully the Risen Christ's commandment of love we must know how to translate it into action. When we try to translate "His" love into an active participation in loving, we must understand how to bring our "game" to a new level. Using the Old Testament and ancient Greek philosopher's concept of love we have a great starting point. I will lay out in print these concepts so that they can be a true tool for you to use in your daily life.



Sh'ma Yisrael - These are the first two words of the prayer of Israel (Hear Israel) that would be proclaimed at least four times a day:

*Hear O Israel, The Lord our God is Lord alone.
You should love Him with all your Heart, Soul,
Mind and Strength....*

This prayer outlines a beautiful relationship between God and Man. As man comes to recognize that there is ONLY ONE God he is admitting that all others are false... including himself.

"No one can serve two masters... He will love the one and hate the other... "
(Matt 6:24)

With this concept as the catalyst to "loving" one must realize that he identifies his ability to do so with **Heart, Soul, Mind and Strength**.

If he gives these things to God then he has submitted to His Divine omnipotence and the driving force of love itself. So how do we define these ways of love and how do they limit us to love as God loves?

Four Philosophical Concepts of Love: To understand these four ways philosophically will help us to see their limits and their need to be complete.

Heart - The heart has always been the symbol of the human emotions so therefore, “Eros”, love corresponds to this physical... human type of love. Eros calls into play all of our senses. It is the love that electrifies our experience of another. Fully engaged in this way we fall head (infatuated) over hills “in love” with another.

This sensual “erotic” love is a purely emotional and self-serving love. It lasts only for a time.

Mind - The mind is the seat of intellectual enlightenment. It is here that Plato says that (Platonic) love should lie. The bodily love of Eros distracts the mind from a greater gift that can be shared. The intellect allows one to set aside the bodily desires and develop a deeper and more meaningful way of life. It allows you to identify with your existence - “I think therefore I am.” However, this kind of love alone is usually a love that becomes a “Mutual Admiration” society where the other is a sounding board to your intellectual prowess.

Strength - Friendship (philia) love is a calling of collective strengths between people allowing their bond to make them stronger, more confident and to not stand alone but in and with the love of the other. Best friends compliment each other and the “need” is a shared experience. This “love” is only as strong as the mutual desires remain the same. If focus, values or opportunities change so does the relationship.

Soul - Agape love is the Divine Love that only God can provide with perfection. It is unconditionally given and is not predicated on the ability of the other to return the favor. The giver gives not out of need but out of pure love to share love! This here becomes the lynch pin and the perspective that only can be gained by human persons in light of the Resurrection and the Glory of Christ.

Trading in Weak Love for Perfect Love - When Jesus asks us to love as He loves the mission is to step aside and trade in our hearts, minds, souls and strength for that which is His love.

Trading in Heart of Lust and Pure Selfish Desires for - Mercy and Compassion which makes us ministers of healing

Trading in Intellectual stimulation for - Wisdom that will transform our lives into disciples of Christ

Trading in Strength of Friendship that elevates our self worth (Pride) for - Humility that strengthens us under the cross

Trading in Souls that long for perfection weighed by sin for - The Divine gift of the inexhaustible charity that calls us to taste the heavenly kingdom.

Love one another as I have loved you is the calling to take the four aspects of love and make them perfect in the Glory of Christ. It is in this love for which we gain peace in being ministers of Christ’s presence.


PRAYER TO SAINT MICHAEL


