SINS AGAINST THE HOLY SPIRIT

(Part 4 of 7)

In the first article of the series about Blasphemes against the Holy Spirit we reflected on how Jesus warns that a house that is divided against itself cannot stand. Standing guard of our treasures, as to put them under lock and key, is not the way to be strong enough to protect them. Rather one must participate in the gifts of the Holy Spirit to recognize that their value is worth more than the sleep of worldly lure. Being "tied up" begins with each and every little thread of sin that slowly binds us to the ground... to the earthly desire... and takes away our freedom. This leads us to forget the value of the Spiritual gifts and denounce them (blaspheme) which leads to certain death. Last few weeks we discussed the first two blaspheme against the Holy Spirit: (Despair) and Presumption. This week we will discuss impugning the known truth.

"It would be better for him if a millstone were put around his neck and he be thrown into the sea than for him to cause one of these little ones to sin." (Luke 17)

Watering Down the Known Truth - To water down the known truth means to weaken it by making all religious truths subjective (claiming that there is no objective truth), to attack it by word or argument, to resist it, to contradict it, or even to oppose the known truth or to challenge it as false.

False Teachings of Many Forms - This sin against the Holy Spirit comes in many forms at many levels but it all serves the same purpose in the long-run and that is to lead someone away from the truth and the opportunity to strive for "Spiritual" perfection. This act of impugning the truth can be an act against Dogmatic, Moral and Church teachings as they have been revealed by the Holy Spirit through the teaching of Christ who came to reveal the Father's love. This sin can fall to theologians, protestors, parish priest, catechist, parents and friends or neighbors.

Heresy - Heresy is a formal denouncing of a teaching that is contrary to Faith and Morals. The Church has suffered such heretics that have taught against the Holy Trinity, the Two Natures of Christ, the Papacy, Blessed Virgin Mary as the Mother of God and many other issues that deal with the misleading of the faithful from the Truth. This type of impugning of the Truth has always been handled on the level of declaration of Dogmatic pronouncements and the official excommunication of the heretic. Nevertheless many have succumbed to these false teachings and have been lead astray.



Wolves in Lambs Clothing - The worse, however are those who water down the truth to make it seem that one has the right to choose more or less of an article of Faith. The choice is usually less on the intellectual premise of the teaching and more on the level of "excusing" one not to be restricted by challenging moral ideals or mystical revelations. The watering down of the Truth is to win people onto the path of the "lukewarm" and away from a life in the Holy Spirit. Jesus said: "Be hot or cold.. But if you are lukewarm I will spew you from my mouth." There is no place in the

spiritual life for those who accept "half truths" as an "okay" way to approach the kingdom of God. Just like Gulliver, when one falls asleep under such allurements of the easy peasy approach of the "big box" churches find themselves eaten by the wolf of sin while thinking they were approaching the truth of the "Lamb of God!"

Examples of Impugning the Truth

- ✠ It is not necessary to believe in Jesus as truly divine.... As long as you follow his message.
- ✠ Jesus did not mean for us to be cannibals, therefore the bread and wine does not become His Body and Blood... it is just a symbol.
- ✠ No need to fast an hour before Holy Communion.
- ✠ It is okay to miss Sunday Mass on occasions... Our lives are busy and there are all those sports games to play.
- ✠ No need to go to the sacrament of reconciliation... just tell God you are sorry and he forgives you.
- ✠ The Pope does not have any real authority of you as a Catholic. He is just a figure head of the institution.
- ✠ Cohabiting is okay ... or any sexual relationship is okay as long as you love each other.
- ✠ There might be a Hell... but God would never send anyone there because His Love is so great.
- ✠ All Religions are basically the same....
- ✠ God gave us each free choice... what is true or sinful for one person may not be true or sinful for you.
- ✠ The teachings of the Church are not valid if they cannot be found in the bible.
- ✠ Marriage is to make you happy and if you are unhappy you should not remain married.
- ✠ The Ten Commandments are more suggestions... no one can keep all of them but should try.
- ✠ Since Jesus died on the cross for us we need not to worry about sin but be thankful that he loves us.
- ✠ You do not need to Worship at Mass... God is everywhere.... Take a hike or sit on the beach... He is there.

I can go on and on with the type of examples that people can easily agree to by the power of suggestion, practice and teaching of those who are trusted to be “Good Christians” and knowledgeable in the faith as a cleric, teacher or parent. Most people want to find an easier path but don’t want to wander alone.. So the take the hand (suggestion) of supposedly trust-worthy people and walk into a state of emptiness where the Holy Spirit and the life of Grace is being denied.

WHY DOES IT HAPPEN?

Many who lead others away from absolute truth or the discipline of moral teaching have failed to believe or live it in their own lives. They have found it unbelievable, archaic or too restrictive to live. They cannot believe in such a God or the challenge that comes with spiritual perfection. Since they cannot live it why impose such things on others.

Another reason is that they want to be loved. Yes they want to make it easy for those who love them. To excuse children from the practice of the Faith always leads to such watering down the faith so they can still be seen as “good” and loved by God. The unfortunate thing is that God loves them and wants to love them into a fuller life but we impede it by teaching falsely.

How to Combat Impugning the Truth

- ✠ Make sure first that you seek the truth. Live the truth and discuss your disbelief in confession.
- ✠ Use the proper sources such as the Catechism of the Catholic Church for answers not some on-line chat room.
- ✠ Do not allow your desire to excuse another to soften the truth of Faith, morals and practice.
- ✠ Do not allow your own weakness to lead others to the same weakness.
- ✠ Trust in the Holy Spirit to give you wisdom, understanding and knowledge to love the Truth.
- ✠ Trust the Holy Spirit to give you Fear of the Lord and the gift of Reverence to desire Truth over the easier path.
- ✠ Trust the Holy Spirit to give you the gift of Courage and Right Council not lead anyone astray.



and his kingdom will have no end.


