**SINS AGAINST THE HOLY SPIRIT**

(Part 6 of 7)

In the first article of the series about Blasphemes against the Holy Spirit we reflected on how Jesus warns that a house that is divided against itself it cannot stand. Standing guard of our treasures, as to put them under Lock and Key, is not the way to be strong enough to protect them. Rather one must participate in the gifts of the Holy Spirit to recognize that their value is worth more than the sleep of worldly lure. Being "tied up" begins with each and every little thread of sin that slowly binds us to the ground... to the earthly desire..... and takes away our freedom. This leads us to forget the value of the Spiritual gifts and denounce them (blaspheme) which leads to certain death. Last four weeks we discussed the first four blaspheme against the Holy Spirit: Despair, Presumption, Impugning the known truth and Envy of another's spiritual gifts. This week we will discuss Obstinacy in sin.

Obstinacy in sin : to be "obstinate" means to resist the sanctifying power of the Holy Spirit, to be stubborn, to persist in sin, to be unyielding.

WARNING: The Slope is getting Slippery!

The progression towards the last and final sin against the Holy Spirit (impenitence) is becoming harder and harder to avoid as one participates in the first five sins. But obstinacy is like adding liquid soap to a steep slide into hell. There is no stopping when one finally becomes obstinate in a particular sin that is accepted as a part of their life. There are a variety of ways to "excuse" and many acceptable names to give such a way of life.... But call it what you may and make excuses all you want... but it leads to only one end... and that end is eternal separation from God's love.

It All Starts with a Moment of Weakness...

I remember when I thought (age 9) that I could never imagine stealing something from the candy store. It seemed incomprehensible that I would take what was not mine and keep it for my own pleasure. My friends freely took penny candy from the counter top as if they were taking a mint from the teller's window. That led to rigging the old fashion Pepsi machine in a way that two bottles dispensed for the price of one. This act of personal "BOGO" shopping was followed by fraudulent pool passes and concession tickets. I knew what they were doing was wrong... I was blessed to have a good moral sense and a weekly 25 cent allowance from my grandma that kept me from falling into this temptation. My friends excused it in the similar fashion that most people excuse the act of stealing: The store will never miss a piece of bubble gum... or I paid for the one so it's okay to have the second one free.... We paid for passes last year and hardly ever got to use them because of bad weather ... and... the most absurd one: The concession stand should give free food because you already paid for the pass... Kids stuff huh? Well Kids stuff and Kid sins turn into Adult Stuff and Adult sins. The reasoning does not change but the damage and seriousness of the sin becomes grave.



So one day I accepted that extra bottle of Pepsi from my friend who took two. I reasoned that I was accepting the one he paid for... and he was drinking the one he stole. No sin on my part... no guilt. It became easier as the days wore on... and having that extra dime to spend on something else came in handy. It took my mom; in a story I will tell you some other day, to make me realize how wrong it was to accept stolen property. But it became easy to fall into a sin and the excuses that allow one to perpetuate them until the slope is too slippery and the ride ends badly.

Top Seven Excuses of Remaining Persistent and Obstinate in Serious Sin

Plausible deniability and justification by choice leads away from a Truth and to an acceptance of Sin.

Here are the top seven reasons given when confronted with the Truth and error of the sinner:

I just like it too much to give it up.

It's just a habit... not life threatening.

Everyone has a Vice.

It will hurt too many people if I give it up.

I am in too deep now that there is no turning back.

I am a good person so how can this choice make or break me?

That is the opinion of the Church that is behind the times.

No way to deny the excuses are lame but sin is powerful and it's allurement deadly.

Ways to Beat the Grasp of Obstinacy in Sin:

Hate it: Eventually, one recognizes that a particular sin gives a momentary pleasure and a longer lasting sadness. Hate that effect more than the fleeting pleasure.

Starve it: Do not play into the occasion of Sin. Don't climb the ladder of the slide that leads down that slippery slope

Corner it: This takes real strength.... Don't soften the acceptance of a sin with trying to tip the scales with your good deeds or human kindness... make it your enemy... don't allow it to freely excuse itself.

Overwhelm it: Prayer, sacramental confession and frequent Holy Communion!!! Overwhelm it with the love and Grace of God's Peace. This allows the Holy Spirit to take its proper place.

Next week: **Final impenitence** "Impenitence" means to be uncontrite, unrepentant, hardened, unconverted, to be without regret, shame or remorse.



Now, with the impact of the pandemic considerably reduced, it is again possible for the faithful to assemble for the Eucharist and the time for us to lift the dispensation from the obligation."*



