

“STRAIGHT UP IS THE ONLY WAY”

*How narrow the gate and constricted the road that leads to life.
And those who find it are few*

Matthew 7:10

In the 1970's when I was preparing to take on the privilege of driving an automobile Pennsylvania had a slogan: "Drive Defensively." The purpose was for those who were driving their vehicle to be aware of all the dangers that they may encounter on the road so that you could travel safely from point A to point B.

Many things have changed since the 70's and driving is no exception. We no longer drive defensively, we drive offensively. I don't mean people drive as if on offense, but simply their driving is offensive. They roll through stop signs and no one seems to use their turn signals anymore and the only one who seems to use them is the person who is turning left... six miles down the road. People who are driving are talking on their phones and worst yet, texting and even worse yet I saw someone on the parkway shaving and reading the newspaper at the same time. Speed... How fast people drive now... People just drive so fast, almost aimlessly pedal to the medal. In the 70's the speed limit was moved to 55 miles an hour. Remember the slogan: "55 saves lives." Now we drive at 70 miles an hour, now I am not complaining because I like to drive fast, and with exception to texting and driving I am sure I am as guilty as you for trying to multi-task behind the wheel.

The greatest mystery however, is when people are driving and doing whatever else they do seem to be only frightened of one thing and that is a tunnel! Yes. It never fails. Traffic is flying along and then you come to a tunnel and everything stops! What is that? Are people really afraid that they can not fit into the tunnel? And to one up the fear of the tunnel is how once you are in the tunnel and you come out on the other side all the cars are gone? Where did they go?

The tunnel vision of driving that seems to be a phenomenon for all Western Pennsylvanians serves well as Jesus understands this when He is asked the questions who will enter into the Kingdom of Heaven and He answers: "Many will try to enter the narrow (tunnel) gate but will not be strong enough." Strange Jesus would say that we will not be strong enough but what He means is that we will not be disciplined enough to enter... to have the necessary razor (20/20) vision to remain undistracted or undeterred to enter.

Eye on the prize (heaven) must be directed by instruction and correction. These two disciplines keep us on the narrow path. The church instructs on the necessary approach to drive in the fast lane of Truth and morals while she corrects our route by alarming us to the greater dangers that can blur our vision or make us fearful to enter with confidence the heavenly kingdom. These distractions are usually in the form of trials and tribulations for they are things that cleanse us from worldly distractions. This is where we must remember that narrow roads/gates need laser focus. Laser focus is to leave go of worldly wants and desires for the long-term joy of heaven. To have the confidence in heavenly discipline so we are NOT afraid that when we enter the tunnel and come out the other side that we will disappear but find eternal Bliss!



I remember my first trip through the Liberty tunnels (tubes) going to my grandmother's who lived on Mt. Washington. I drove from Lower Burrell to this point with no problem. When I approached the tunnel, I started to slow down. My dad recognized what I was doing to he said: "John, don't worry, just aim it and hit the gas!"

The confidence that we will enter into the heavenly kingdom must come from the recognition that we can't have both the things of this world and heaven as well. So, my new slogan is: *"Heaven, don't miss it for the world"* speaks to the choice of choosing the "one way" approach that leads straight up instead of to a dead end. The one-way sign represents the narrow path that one walks and desires through recognizing the mortality of life. Going up is only accomplished when one has their eye on the prize progressing undistracted so that when the narrow gate approaches there will not be any fear of being able to enter for we can trust that we have been trimmed to fit and now all that is left is to "Aim it and hit the gas."

Heaven: "Don't miss it for the world" is a serious proposal! When you are sick and facing the reality of your mortality earthly pleasures and pursuits do not hold much weight and value. The pandemic and my recent diagnosis have solidified that in my life and spirituality. I love my sports, food and laughter with friends. I never had any monetary pursuits that obsessed me but being a successful pastor and loving pastor is where the sin of pride could rear its head. But now, I am in survival mode which means God's Grace is sufficient for me In my weakness is my power, my pain true gain, and the cross the standard of victory. Yeah... more than ever, Heaven.... I refuse to miss it for the world!

The Hall of Fame: Mortal Man's Heaven



While finishing up my past chemotherapy I took time to watch the football hall of fame speeches knowing that there would be 5 Steelers who would be inducted over the weekend!

That is a total of 29 players/coaches/owners which, I believe denotes a separate wing to be erected.

This mortal man's heaven has a process that brings each inductee to his moment of fame. After 5 years in retirement they can become a first ballot selection to be inducted to the hall. Some like Troy are first ballot selections others like Donnie Shell have waited a quarter century to get the nod.

I couldn't wait to hear what each Steeler would have to say about their journey into the hall of the hall fame how important it was to be a Pittsburgh Steeler and what a foundation they received being under the leadership of the Rooney family. But of course you know me better than that, I was much more interested to see what kind of role God played in their lives as they come to the mortal hall of fame and hoping for the immortal hall that will follow in heaven.

Three notables were Troy Polamalu, Bill Cowher and Donnie Shell.

Troy who referenced football as a way for him to find the fullest meaning in life physically, mentally and of course Spiritually. Troy did not need to say much about his Faith because he wore it on his wrist (very noticeable rosary bracelet) and of course the constant making of the sign of the cross before and after every play throughout his career left very little doubt what his faith meant to Him. His humble personality is not that of a preacher but as a student of Faith. Students sometimes speak louder with actions than words and of course Troy always did.



Coach Cowher did little to reference Faith until he began to call to mind his deceased wife and owners. He told the story about how Dan Rooney gave him a rosary during the Super Bowl run that year. Cowher said: "Mr. Rooney I am not even Catholic." And Dan said: "The rosary couldn't hurt. Even for a non-Catholic Coach Cowher understood the power of those beads as a way to conjure up the Divine and more so those who where on the other side of heavens gate. When he spoke about knowing how proud his wife and Dan Rooney would be for him entering the Hall of Fame he raised the rosary heavenward. A great outward sign and recognition that mortal men still seek the immortal and those who share in that promise.



But Donnie Shell was the one who took time to actually quote scripture and was very insightful to how a humble man does not lose his way waiting to be recognized for that mortal achievement when the road does not end in Canton Ohio but only leads to glory of the whole body of work. As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him.


Jesus then said to the Twelve, “Do you also want to leave?” Simon Peter answered him, “Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.




