Lenten Fish Fry Cancelled this Year

After meeting with our social and fundraising committees, once again the Lenten Fish Fry is being put on hold till next year.



With the Covid virus as a constant "dark cloud" hanging over every social event concerns of a successful fish fry are in doubt. But more so the inflated cost of the product and supplies has made it obvious that it would be very difficult to make a profit that would reflect the hard work and planning of the event. Fish used to be a low-cost commodity but in our economic climate today that is no longer true. After researching prices and availability we decided to put the fish fry on hold this year and concentrate on other fund raisers to support the parish mission.

I want to thank everyone who supports our annual fish fry, the leadership and the workers of the past. I really hope next year will find us in a better economy and afford us the wonderful gatherings that the fish fry brings to parish life.

CATHOLIC TRADITION: DEVOTIONAL AND LITURGICAL CANDLES

The practice of lighting candles is an important tradition in Catholic churches, communities and families. Its origins may be traced back in the Old Testament times where an oil lamp is lit to "keep a flame burning perpetually" (Exodus 27:19-20) and as a "lamp stand in the Tent of Meeting...from generation to generation" (Exodus 30:7-8) "set up before the Lord as He has commanded Moses" (Exodus 40:24-25).

The New Testament further highlights the sanctity of this light in Paul's Letter to the Hebrews. "A first tent was prepared with the lamp stand, the table and the bread of the presence; this is called the Holy Place" (Hebrews 9:2). In today's Catholic tradition, this light has a very special place because it symbolizes Christ who said, "I am the Light of the world; the one who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have light and life" (John 8:12).

In most every part of Catholic celebrations and rituals, lighting of candles plays a very significant role. Candles are lighted during the celebration of the Mass, on liturgical and funeral processions and evening prayer ceremonies. Candles are lit before the Tabernacle to signify the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament and to call for reverence on the part of the faithful.

In the Sacrament of Baptism, as a person is initiated into the Church, a candle is lit from the Paschal Candle, the symbol, His passion, His death and His resurrection. The person receives the Light of Christ that he— of Christ's Paschal Mystery may live and walk the path of God's children and keep the flame of faith burning alive in his heart. And as he receives this indelible baptismal mark, he shall meet the tending Mass regularly, and support the Lord and be one with all the saints in Heaven when the right time comes.



Candles are lit before an image of our Lord and before the saints. Catholics practice this not to honor the image itself but the one it truly represents. The lit candle symbolizes a prayer offering where we present our petitions to the Lord and ask the saints to pray with us and to pray for us during our most dire need. This light, as it is kept burning, also shows our desire to remain in God's presence as we go through our daily duties at home and in the workplace.

Candles lit before Christ's image also shows our reverence to Him who deserves our adoration and

thanksgiving and who alone can forgive our sins and bring us back into deeper relationship with Him.

Let us then bear in mind that as we celebrate our sacred liturgies, our sacraments and our special prayers, Christ, the Source of all Light, shall come to us to be ever present to strengthen us, instruct us, inspire us hope that His Light will never burn out as long as we live in faith without a shadow of doubt that darkness will ever defeat us.

PASS ON THE TRADITION TO YOUR CHILDREN

Catholic Traditions of Sacramentals are so important to pass on to our children and participate in them as a family. Lighting candles at church...saying a prayer together and leaving knowing that it continues to be offered on your behalf was a great comfort to me as a child. Take advantage of lighting a candle at the Blessed Mother, Saint Joseph, Divine Mercy and other statues throughout the church. Devotional lights remind us that we are in constant communication with our Lord and those who served Him faithfully.







CPSL clearances **are only valid for** *FIVE* **years** and must be obtained again by both employees and volunteers every *FIVE* years.

The required trainings and clearances include:

Mandated and Permissive Reporting Training Course Virtus – Protecting God's Children.

Diocese of Greensburg Code of Pastoral Conduct
Pa State Police Criminal History Report. **There is NO fee for a volunteer.**

Child Abuse History Clearances. There is NO fee for a volunteer. Certification for the purpose of "volunteer" may be obtained free of charge once every 57 months. Do not apply for renewal prior to the 57 months – otherwise there will be a fee for volunteers.


FBI Criminal History Report (Fingerprints required) – or -if you have been a Pa resident for the past 10 consecutive years: a notarized Volunteer Affidavit.


