HAPPY VALENTINE'S DAY!!

The celebration of Valentine's Day comes to us from a mixed cultural of folklore and truth. Folklore tells us of a love-letter writing imprisoned Christian named Valentine who had a "thing" for

the jailer's daughter. He would write letters and sign it....
"From your Valentine". How sweet is that? He also was believed to have been martyred and thus the title of Saint. As we know such stories become inter-



twined with pagan practices that allow them to gain their promotion and notoriety in the secular form. Take such a story of St. Valentine and couple it with the "Bad boy-angel" Cupid who playfully shoots his arrows of desire which brings destined hearts to a bond of love.... You have now what we call "Valentine's Day". This of course, because "Hallmark" says so, is the day for lovers to express their love!!!. What started out as a simple sharing of love for another has snowballed into a day of heart break for every male who feels obligated to express that love at great expense and originality. Where a card coupled with candy or flowers used to suffice one must be much more original. Hallmark has passed the torch to a more sophisticated market such as the jeweler and escape weekend retailers.

But today let us simplify and purify our intentions of loving affection as it comes to us through the greatest expression of commitment and love one could ever share: MARRIAGE!!! Marriage is more real than flowers or candy. Marriage is the gift of love that keeps on giving! The sanctity of marriage and the family




Husband and wife, by the covenant of marriage, are no longer... two, but one flesh. By their intimate union of persons and of actions they give mutual help and service to each other, experience the meaning of their unity, and gain an ever deeper understanding of it day by day. This intimate union in the mutual self-giving of two persons, as well as the good of the children, demands full fidelity from both, and an indissoluble unity between them.

Christ the Lord has abundantly blessed this richly complex love which springs from the divine source of love and is founded on the model of his union with the Church. In earlier times God met his people in a covenant of love and fidelity. So now the Savior of mankind, the Bridegroom of the Church, meets Christian husbands and wives in the sacrament of matrimony. Further, he remains with them in order that, as he loved the Church and gave himself up for her, so husband and wife may, in mutual self-giving, love each other with perpetual fidelity.

True married love is caught up into God's love; it is guided and enriched by the redeeming power of Christ and the saving action of the Church, in order that the partners may be effectively led to God and receive help and strength in the sublime responsibility of parenthood.

Christian partners are therefore strengthened, and as it were consecrated, by a special sacrament for the duties and the dignity of their state. By the power of this sacrament they fulfill their obligations to each other and to



their family and are filled with the spirit of Christ. This spirit pervades their whole lives with faith, hope and love. Thus they promote their own perfection and each other's sanctification, and so contribute together to the greater glory of God.

Hence, with parents leading the way by example and family prayer, their children – indeed, all within the family circle – will find it easier to make progress in natural virtues, in salvation and in holiness. Husband and wife, raised to the dignity and

the responsibility of parenthood, will be zealous in fulfilling their task as educators, especially in the sphere of religious education, a task that is primarily their own.

Children, as active members of the family, contribute in their own way to the holiness of their parents. With the love of grateful hearts, with loving respect and trust, they will return the generosity of their parents and will stand by them as true sons and daughters when they meet with hardship and the loneliness of old age.







CPSL Clearances—all staff and ALL volunteers who have direct contact with children, including all Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, Ushers, Adult and Youth Choir, Adult Altar servers, Religious Formation Catechists and aides, Parent helpers for Faith Formation, Vacation Bible School, Children's Liturgy, Greeters, Fish Fry workers, picnic volunteers, and anyone having contact with children are required to complete all six of the clearances/trainings listed below.

CPSL clearances **are only valid for** *FIVE* **years** and must be obtained again by both employees and volunteers every *FIVE* years.

The required trainings and clearances include:

Mandated and Permissive Reporting Training Course Virtus – Protecting God's Children.

Diocese of Greensburg Code of Pastoral Conduct Pa State Police Criminal History Report. **There is NO fee for a volunteer.**

Child Abuse History Clearances. There is NO fee for a volunteer. Certification for the purpose of "volunteer" may be obtained free of charge once every 57 months. Do not apply for renewal prior to the 57 months – otherwise there will be a fee for volunteers.

FBI Criminal History Report (Fingerprints required) – or -if you have been a Pa resident for the past 10 consecutive years: a notarized Volunteer Affidavit.


