

It is hard to believe that the Lenten Season is only three days away! I am looking forward to an exciting Lenten Journey with our parish as I will be offering a Friday night Conference

during Lent. Also, we will be holding the Men's and Women's sessions on the weekends to discuss the Seven Deadly Sins! This same course will be offered one evening during the week for those who cannot make the early morning weekend sessions! Coupled with the opportunity of Friday Stations of the

Cross and the visit from the Bishop to Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton (March 16th) for a Lenten Reflection our time in those forty-days will be well utilized!

All parishioners from both of my parishes are invited to attend the activities! I will be filming the Friday Conferences for OSM from Immaculate Conception to provide a chance to share with those who cannot be there in person. I hope you will consider these opportunities and encourage friends and family members to join you! Here is a synopsis of what is coming your way!!

Father John will share three Friday night conferences following the Stations of the Cross at Immaculate Conception highlighting the incredible call of Simon of Cyrene to aid Jesus on His way to Calvary.

THE SECOND MILE THE CALL OF A DISCIPLE

The Romans pressed Simon the Cyrenian into their service to aid Jesus' in carrying His cross to Calvary. Jesus tells us in the sacred scriptures: "Unless you pick up your cross and follow me, you cannot be my disciple." Carrying our own cross seems to be a useless and unwanted burden in life. The trails of suffering and spiritual challenge often overwhelm us and can set us into a place of doubt. But, as we learn from Simon, we must walk with Christ under His cross to gain the necessary perspective of the value of redemptive suffering! What does Simon experience in this intimate encounter? How does it change him from being a simple "passer-by" to a great disciple?

SNAP SHOT REFERENCE – As I love to do for my conferences I have chosen a painting depicting the scene that we will meditate upon and use as a reference to the story that is told. The painting will give us the focus of our meditation and the challenge to imagine ourselves sharing in this act of true Mercy which leads to discipleship.


Bishop to make pastoral visits during Lent

LENT 2022— Lent begins on Ash Weds, March 2nd and ends on the evening of Holy Thursday. It is a time in which Catholics make sacrifice and perform charitable works as penance for sins. The Ashes were made by burning the palms used last year on Palm Sunday. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are required to FAST on Ash Weds and Good Friday. Fasting means one large meal -or- one main meal with 2 smaller meals. Catholics are also required to ABSTAIN from eating meat on Ash Weds and ALL Fridays during Lent for those 14 years of age and older. You will notice the color Purple is used. This is a sign of penance, sacrifice and preparation and is worn during the seasons of Lent and Advent.



6th Grade Formation - Sessions will remain virtual for all March sessions with in-person sessions beginning on April 12th.






