

Easter Fifty Days of Awe and Wonder!!!

Thoughts while driving home

As I drove to my family home to celebrate Easter, I reflected, in silence, how blessed I was to have experienced Lent. the Holy Triduum and Easer Sunday with my parish families. I thought how wonderful it was to see so many participate in the conference "The Second Mile" both in person and via our "You Tube channel". Many others took time to participate in the discussion groups at both parishes concerning the seven deadly sins and seven lively virtues. Others faithfully attending daily Mass and the Devotion of the Stations of the Cross. Without the fear of the pandemic hanging over our heads all of the Holy week devotions were well attended again!... I smiled to myself thinking that if we are in pursuit of "the best version of ourselves," we have found the "start here" sign during Lent. I hope that continuing through the Easter Season; we will walk the road with the Risen Christ, leading us to understand that He is the Way, the Truth and Life itself. Easter is so powerful and so overwhelming that it cannot be grasped in one Liturgy! So I thought again ... Can we keep it alive in our hearts through the whole season of Easter? Can we look at familiar things that we celebrate as a community and see how it is truty all about the Resurrection? I hoped that we could and I thought that I would share a few thoughts to probe us onward...

The Easter Challenge

Lent is over now and with Easter joy it is hard not to immediately cease our particular Lenten discipline: attending an extra Mass each week, the special hour of prayer or spiritual reading we promised to try to do, being more

patient, eating less and giving more of ourselves to others with greater awareness of Christ suffering on the Cross. That is Lent... but what about Easter? What should we do out of Easter Joy?

In readings we hear during the Easter season, it is clear that for the infant Church, Easter was a beginning. Of course, all beginnings are also endings. For the disciples it was the end of a magical time. They didn't all know it but they had been walking, eating and talking with...God! Yet, as magical as that must have been, they hadn't yet consumed God. They hadn't begun the process of taken God in and becoming divine themselves. They didn't yet have "resurrection eyes"... that ability to see things as they really are...to see as God sees...that was later.

On Easter, the disciples stood at the empty tomb and were darned confused. Slowly out of that confusion, fear and sadness grew a little ragtag band of folks from a little ragtag part of the world who just happened to change the course of history. Easter marked the beginning of the Christian community. Easter Joy gave even a greater appreciation in discipline as well as acts of love and charity. Imagine the promise of eternal joy that cannot be interfered by the worries of pain, money, loneliness or SIN!!! Wow!!!! The Christian community is the 'forum" to this new way of selfless living.



The Self-help book that has worked for over 2,000 years!!!

The scriptures, of the New Testament, have been provided to us by the Faith and Tradition of the early Christian Community. All other such "self-help" books are cheap "knock-offs" of this original source and they have lost the effectiveness that Christ gives to the original. Read more carefully the Readings for the upcoming Sunday Liturgies and the ones provided in the "little white book" and see how this forum will reinforce your pursuit for happiness!!!

A Proper Easter Diet that leads to a slimmer You!

The Easter Diet is more than just eggs, chocolate, kielbasa and ham... it is a steady diet of the Sacraments of Eucharist and reconciliation as well! Remember, our Easter Duty is to participate in both these sacraments before Pentecost. I suggest participating in the Eucharist as often as you can... at least twice a week and Reconciliation monthly. This regiment will slim you down around the sin list and firm up your intentions to spread the Good News! Clogged arteries may stop the heart but a clean soul and a giving heart pushes you to the Eternal.

Easter Exercise Regimen that guarantees a loving community of Faith!

Exercising the "Hope", of sharing in the "Eternal Kingdom", will lead to more trust and less suspicion; more companionship and less loneliness; more appreciation for each other and less taking for granted; more forgiveness and less accusation; more true communication and less posturing; more truth-telling and less strategizing; more love and less apathy; more long, leisurely hours with those we love and less hurried hugs thrown at each other as we run out the door.

Remember! Hope... It only will get better each day and will last forever when we perform the above regiment within our Christian community...



Keeping Easter joy alive throughout the year

Easter Sunday celebrates Jesus' victory over death, sin, and Satan. In fact, it is the most important event in human history. This joy Easter inspires can't be contained to just one day; the Church gives us a whole season to celebrate. Try these ideas to prolong the joy of Easter:

Keep a Lenten practice that helped you grow closer to God – a small sacrifice to honor His sacrifice. For example, attend an extra Mass during the week, or perform an act of charity to share God's love.

Decorate the house. Celebrate the victory Christ won for you. Display an image of the Risen Christ in your home. Decorate crosses and statues with white sashes. Put out bouquets of flowers (real or silk) for the garden in which Jesus rose (John 19:41).

Proclaim the Good News. Mary Magdalene was the first to share the news of the Resurrection (John 20:17). Share it, too, by wearing a cross or crucifix, saying grace in public, talking about His grace, imitating His forgiveness.

Q&A:

Why do Catholics display crucifixes?

Catholics display the Crucifix because it reminds us of Jesus' sacrifice, His victory, and His love for us.

His sacrifice. Jesus willingly sacrificed Himself for us on the Cross. At every Mass, the moment of Jesus' sacrifice is made mysteriously present again in the sacrifice of the Eucharist in an unbloody manner. The Crucifix indicates that the sacrifice of the Cross and the Mass are one sacrifice (*CCC* #1545).

His victory. The Crucifix looks like defeat, but in fact, it's a sign of victory. Jesus' sacrifice reconciled us with God, reopened Heaven to us, and broke the grip of death. Jesus took on death, sin, and evil, and rose again triumph.

His love. "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). The Crucifix reveals how precious we are to God. Jesus taught us that true love seeks the good of the other. Jesus put our good first. He endured the crucifixion so we be with Him forever in Heaven.



From Scripture:

John 20:19-31, "Jesus, I trust in You"

The two Resurrection appearances of Jesus to His disciples in this passage highlight God's merciful love. The first appearance was on Easter Sunday. Jesus could have abandoned His Apostles, just as they had abandoned Him in the Garden of Gethsemane, but He

didn't. Instead, Jesus appeared to them and gave them His peace, His Spirit, and the power to forgive sins in His name.

The second visit was for "Doubting" Thomas, who wasn't present for the first appearance. Thomas couldn't believe that Jesus was really risen, despite the accounts of eyewitnesses. He demanded physical proof. Jesus appeared in the Upper Room and invited Thomas to investigate. St. Thomas, moved to faith, cried out, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:28).

This passage reminds us we can always bring our doubts, fears, and need for forgiveness to God, especially on the Sunday after Easter — Divine Mercy Sunday. To the disciples who abandoned Him, Jesus extended His peace and forgiveness. For St. Thomas who had been struggling with doubt, Jesus came in person to strengthen his faith. "Jesus, I trust in You!"

PRAYER TO SAINT MICHAEL

Saint Michael, the Archangel, defend us in battle; be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, thrust into Hell Satan and the other evil spirits who prowl about the world for the ruin of souls. Amen.




Queen of Angels you have a school age child? Have you considered our parish school, Queen of Angels


