

LENTEN JOURNEY THROUGH THE SUFFERING OF JESUS

TWO SEPARATE AND GREAT OPPORTUNITIES FOR SPIRITUAL GROWTH THIS LENT

NOTE: Both of these Lenten opportunities are intended for the parishioners of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton and Immaculate Conception. The location, Immaculate Conception was chosen to coincide with Tuesday evening Mass and the Friday Stations of the Cross. To optimize these Lenten experiences, I would encourage you to attend first Tuesday evening Mass before the Tuesday reflections and the Stations of the Cross before my presentation on Saint Veronica. It is a great way to be spiritually prepared to enter into the passion of Christ crucified and our call to share in His cross. It is a privilege to be the pastor of parishioners of two parishes who understand the constraints of time and their willingness to share in these opportunities. Although we are two separated parishes we are served by the same priests in the name of one Lord!! United in Faith and in community makes us stronger in Christ!!

FRIDAY NIGHT CONFERENCES

VERONICA: THE TRUE FRIEND OF THE SUFFERING CHRIST



The most precious time of the Liturgical year for me is the Season of Lent. It is a time for us to walk with Christ through His passion, death and resurrection. This walk with Christ allows us to intimately share His love for us by looking more deeply at the journey to the cross. Last year I shared with you, in my Lenten Conferences, a look at Simon (of the cross) and the transformation of his life while barring the weight of the cross for the Lord.

This year I will share reflections on Veronica who sympathetically wipes the face of Jesus and is rewarded with the sacred image of His Divine face! We will explore who Veronica is and how she exemplifies the corporal works of Mercy. We will look at how we can imitate her and examine other Holy women who, throughout history, have followed her lead and see the face of Christ in the people of the world today.

This presentation will be made at the men and women groups on Saturday and Sunday mornings but also in a new setting on Tuesday evenings following Sacred Mass at 6:30 pm.

TUESDAY EVENING PRESENTATION OF: "No Greater Love"

Mark Downey, a parishioner of Immaculate Conception, has volunteered to lead the Tuesday night group! The group will meet in the Children's Liturgy of the Word room next to the body of the Immac-

ulate Conception Church. Mark will supply the group members with "work books" that will provide a study and discussion guide that will be used for home reflections and group sharing.

A 30-minute video will be shared/viewed followed by discussion and sharing on each of the episodes through scripture meditations. The fifth session will conclude the study with last words of Christ from the cross.

Miraculous Medal

Question:

What is the "Miraculous Medal" and why is it called that?

Answer:

The medal of the Immaculate Conception that has come to be called simply the "Miraculous Medal" dates back to an apparition of Mary to Saint Catherine Laboure, who was then a novice sister with the Daughters of Charity. On November 27, 1830, Our



Lady appeared to her standing on a globe, with shafts of light streaming from her hands and the words, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee," surrounding the image. In the same vision, Catherine saw a capital "M" with a cross above it and below two hearts. Catherine seemed to hear a voice telling her to have what she saw struck as a medal and a promise that those who wore the medal would have the protection and intercession of the Mother of God. The first 1,500 of medals were distributed in 1832. Many miraculous favors were attributed to the use of the medal.

Saint Catherine's "Miraculous Medal" is among the recognizable and popular symbols of modern Catholicism. Reflecting on its widespread use, the 2001 Vatican document, "Directory on Popular Piety and Liturgy," observes that the medal "recalls the mystery of Redemption, the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and of the Sorrowful Heart of Mary. It signifies the mediatory role of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mystery of the Church, the relationship between Heaven and earth, this life and eternal life."



Altar Server Training

Calling all young people from 3rd grade to 9th grade!
Altar Servers are needed to help with Sundays, Feast day liturgies and stations during Lent.



Serving benefits the child as they are now being active at Mass (versus being passive) and by participating they begin to learn more about what is happening during the Mass. If your child is bored and not participating this could be a big step for them to start engaging in what is happening at the Mass, what is often referred to as the Divine Liturgy.

<u>Every parent</u> should consider encouraging their child to be a server. To participate in your faith is to understand it better.

There is one evening training which is followed by the new server shadowing a more experience server for a period of time. The more they serve the better and more comfortable they become.

Busy schedule? We use a scheduler that will allow you to put preferences of dates and times in. Also, if you are assigned to a date and you cannot make it you can cancel and an email will go out to all the other servers saying there is an opening to serve. We ask that when you are available you will answer that request. Also, if you just show up that you would be willing to step up and help if needed.




