## CATHOLIC TRADITION: DEVOTIONAL AND LITURGICAL CANDLES "Jesus is the Light of the World"

The practice of lighting candles is an important tradition in Catholic churches, communities and families. Its origins may be traced back in the Old Testament times where an oil lamp is lit to "keep a flame burning perpetually" (Exodus 27:19 -20) and as a "lamp stand in the Tent of Meeting...from generation to generation" (Exodus 30:7-8) "set up before the Lord as He has commanded Moses" (Exodus 40:24-25).



The New Testament further highlights the sanctity of this light in Paul's Letter to the Hebrews. "A first tent was prepared with the lamp stand, the table and the bread of the presence; this is called the Holy Place" (Hebrews 9:2). In today's Catholic tradition, this light has a very special place because it symbolizes Christ who said, "I am the Light of the world; the one who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have light and life" (John 8:12).

In most every part of Catholic celebrations and rituals, lighting of candles plays a very significant role. Candles are lighted during the celebration of the Mass, on liturgical and funeral processions and evening prayer ceremonies. Candles are lit before the Tabernacle to signify the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament and to call for reverence on the part of the faithful.

In the Sacrament of Baptism, as a person is initiated into the Church, a candle is lit from the Paschal Candle, the symbol, His passion, His death and His resurrection. The person receives the Light of Christ that he— of Christ's Paschal Mystery may live and walk the path of God's children and keep the flame of faith burning alive in his heart. And as he receives this indelible baptismal mark, he shall meet the Lord and be one with all the saints in Heaven when the right time comes.

Candles are lit before an image of our Lord and before the saints. Catholics practice this not to honor the image itself but the



one it truly represents. The lit candle symbolizes a prayer offering where we present our petitions to the Lord and ask the saints to pray with us and to pray for us during our most dire need. This light, as it is kept burning, also shows our desire to remain in God's presence as we go through our daily duties at home and in the workplace.

Candles lit before Christ's image also shows our reverence to Him who deserves our adoration and thanksgiving and who alone can forgive our sins and bring us back into deeper relationship with Him.

Let us then bear in mind that as we celebrate our sacred liturgies, our sacraments and our special prayers, Christ, the Source of all Light, shall come to us to be ever present to

strengthen us, instruct us, inspire us hope that His Light will never burn out as long as we live in faith without a shadow of doubt that darkness will ever defeat us.

#### PASS ON THE TRADITION TO YOUR CHILDREN

Catholic Traditions of Sacramentals are so important to pass on to our children and participate in them as a family. Lighting candles at church...saying a prayer together and leaving knowing that it continues to be offered on your behalf was a great comfort to me as a child. Take advantage of lighting a candle at the Blessed Mother, Saint Joseph, Divine Mercy and other statues throughout the church. Devotional lights remind us that we are in constant communication with our Lord and those who serve Him faithfully.

#### SPECIAL CANDLES THAT CAN BE OFFERED

Many times we seek to have a Mass offered for our intentions especially for deceased relatives and those who our suffering. The Mass schedule is so full and hard to get a Mass immediately. Some have found comfort in having a 7 day votive candle lit in their name as an opportunity to keep their prayers before the heavens.

Here are the opportunities to have such candles lit in our Church:

- +Sanctuary Candle- This candle is next to the tabernacle signifying the presence of Jesus in the tabernacle.
- +Altar Candles These are the pillar candles on either side of the altar and burn at every mass.
- +St. Peregrine Candle This seven day candle is at the foot of the statue of Saint Peregrine and burns for those who have cancer
- +St. John Neumann Candle—This seven day candle is located by the statue of St. John Neumann in the children's area in the back of church.

NOTE: Each of these special candles can be scheduled for your loved ones through the parish office. The cost of the Sanctuary & Altar Candles is \$20 for this 7 day candle. The St. Peregrine & St. John Neumann candle are \$25. All other devoted candles (Blessed Mother, St. Joseph & Divine Mercy) are \$3 and the monies can be dropped in the box by the kneelers.

## **Altar Server Training**

Calling all young people from 3<sup>rd</sup> grade to 9<sup>th</sup> grade! Altar Servers are needed to help with Sundays, Feast day liturgies and stations during Lent.



Servers carry the cross and processional candles. They hold the book for the priest celebrant when he is not at the altar. They carry the incense and censer and present the wine along with the water to the priest during the preparation of the gifts or assist him when he receives the gifts from the people. Servers assist in the washing of hands by the priest, ringing the bells during the consecration and assist the priest and deacon as necessary.

Serving benefits the child as they are now being active at Mass (versus being passive) and by participating they begin to learn more about what is happening during the Mass. If your child is bored and not participating this could be a big step for them to start engaging in what is happening at the Mass, what is often referred to as the Divine Liturgy.

<u>Every parent</u> should consider encouraging their child to be a server. To participate in your faith is to understand it better.

There is one evening training which is followed by the new server shadowing a more experience server for a period of time. The more they serve the better and more comfortable they become.

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED Vestment Colors

#### **Question:**

What do the colors of the priest's and deacon's vestments mean? **Answer:** 

In the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, the colors of the vestments evolved over the course of several centuries and there was wide variation both in the colors used, and in the feasts and seasons associated with particular colors. It was Pope Innocent III (d. 1216) who gave us the basic outline that was later prescribed by Pope Saint Pius V in 1570. The various colors remind us of the dominant themes of a particular season or celebration.

- White: Used for the seasons of Christmas and Easter and in celebrations of the Lord, of Mary, the angels, and saints who were not martyrs. This color is also used in Masses for the dead, at baptisms, weddings and other festive celebrations.
- Red: As the color of both blood and fire, red is used on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, as well as Pentecost and special celebrations of the Holy Spirit. Moreover, red is used on the feasts and memorials of the Apostles and those saints who died as martyrs.
- Violet: The color for Advent and Lent. Violet may also be used in Masses for the dead and on All Souls Day (November 2).
- Green: A color of life and hope, green is used throughout Ordinary Time.
- Other colors: Rose may be used on the Third Sunday of Advent and the Fourth Sunday of Lent, black may be used in Masses of the dead and on All Souls Day, gold or silver may be used on solemn occasions in place of white, red, or green.




