

## NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

## Receiving Ashes is dangerous to your life!

A powerful sign of a shared commitment to Christ and the call to conversion.

Lent is a movement from ashes to the baptismal font. We dirty our faces on Ash Wednesday and are cleansed in the new waters of the Easter font. More

profoundly, we embrace the need to die to sin and selfishness at the beginning of Lent so that we can come to fuller life in the Risen One at Easter.

When we receive ashes on our foreheads, we remember who we are. We remember that we are creatures of the earth ("Remember that you are dust"). We remember that we are mortal beings ("and to dust you will return"). We remember that we are baptized. We remember that we are people on a journey of conversion ("Turn away from sin and be faithful to the gospel"). We remember that we are members of the body of Christ (and that smudge on our foreheads will proclaim that identity to others, too).

Renewing our sense of who we really are before God is the core of the Lenten experience. It is so easy to forget, and thus we fall into habits of sin, ways of thinking and living that are contrary to God's will. In this we are like the Ninevites in the story of Jonah. It was "their wickedness" that caused God to send Jonah to preach to them. Jonah resisted that mission and found himself in deep water. Rescued by a large fish, Jonah finally did God's bidding and began to preach in Nineveh. His preaching obviously fell on open ears and hearts, for in one day he prompted the conversion of the whole city.

From the very beginning of Lent, God's word calls us to conversion. If we open our ears and hearts to that word, we will be like the Ninevites not only in their sinfulness but also in their conversion to the Lord. That, simply put, is the point of Ash Wednesday!

WARNING: Allowing the Ashes to be a mark of conversion may afford you the BEST LENT EVER!! Receiving ashes with this intention will destroy the life you know and fill it with a new life unburdened by sin and renewed in Grace.

8:30 AM During Sacred Mass

12:15 PM During the Service (No Mass)

6:30 PM During Sacred Mass

## REMINDER: ASH WEDNESDAY IS A DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE!!!!

The Catholic Church marks this most solemn beginning of the Lenten Season not only with the outward sign of the Ashes received that day but a profound deep sense of preparation and conversion with honoring the Sacred Fast and Abstinence as well. What exactly is required and when in the Fast and Abstinence during Lent?

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

These practices are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59.

**Fasting**: A person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. *Abstinence*: A person must refrain from meat (Fish is not considered "Meat")

Conversion: "A painful realignment to the Truth"

After meeting with our social and fundraising committees, we have decided not to resume a Lenten Fish Fry in the parish. ## EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT



Is gossip a mortal sin?


### Answer:

To really ask this question, we must consider the Eighth Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness."

In its reflections on this commandment, The Catechism of the Catholic Church invites us to not only think about what bearing "false witness" means, but to also consider how we understand the truth and how we communicate more broadly. This is why so much of this section of the Catechism has to do with the gift of language. With this in mind, we will notice that the word "gossip" isn't used by the Catechism. Instead, we find the words "detraction" and "calumny," which are actually two forms that gossip can take, and both can be quite serious.

First, detraction is the of revealing "another's faults and failings to persons who did not know them," without morally valid reasons. Calumny, by extension, is saying something about another person that is untrue, and it is sinful because it "harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgements" (see no. 2477).

In all of our communication, we have to always recognize that we have a moral obligation to the truth and to always work to protect the reputation and honor of our neighbors (see no. 2479). Gossip can, in fact, prove to be a very serious sin. After all, the Catechism reminds us: "No one is bound to reveal the truth to someone who does not have the right to know it" (no. 2489). When we have gossiped, especially if we are aware we have damaged another person's good name or reputation, we want to make every effort to undo the damage we have done, including seeking the grace and forgiveness offered in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.


