



QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK - REFLECT AND RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

First Reading:


Peter's first public speech in Jerusalem focuses on Jesus' connection to King David. In other words, Peter spoke of God's fidelity to Israel in Jesus' resurrection from the dead. What would you like to know about Jesus' *Jewish roots*?

Second Reading:

Peter encourages his community to "conduct yourselves with reverence during the time of your sojourning" (life on earth). How might you show respect to others this week?

Gospel:

We hear how the two disciples on the road to Emmaus finally recognized the risen Jesus in the blessing and breaking of the bread. What helps you recognize the presence of Jesus in your life?





Pastor Notes



PRAY WITHOUT CEASING!!

Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus. Do not quench the Spirit. Test everything; retain what is good. Refrain from every kind of evil. May the God of peace himself make you perfectly holy and may you entirely, spirit, soul, and body, be preserved blameless for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful, and he will also accomplish it.

1 Thessolians 5:16-24

Prayer is such an important aspect of our lives in Christ Jesus.

Paul reminds us that the first prayer should always be a prayer of **Rejoicing**! Even in the midst of trials, tribulations and suffering the first prayer should be one of praise since we know all ends well in the promise of the Resurrection!

The second prayer is that for **perseverance**! To pray without ceasing is a reflection on remaining in the power of the Holy Spirit guiding every step of our day! The words (of unceasing prayer) may change with each breath as we encounter the challenges of the day but their purpose will always remain to persevere in the hope of the risen Christ! So, do not quench the spirit but drink of it with every step so you may test everything and retain what is good!!


The third prayer should reflect the intention found in the “Lord’s Prayer” when we ask to be **delivered from evil** and this is accomplished by recognizing those occasions of sin and responding to the Grace to rebuke them for they only lead to despair.

The fourth prayer is to be **made perfectly holy**, through Grace and Mercy, so we remain blameless as we await His coming.

The caveat here is that the one who calls you to this life of prayer.... if Faithful... He will accomplish it in you!

ANSWER TO PRAYERS!

As you must know by now I have, once again, received good news concerning my health. Monday, April 17th I had my first PET/CT scan since completing the Chemotherapy treatments and it came back clear from any detectable metabolically active disease! This is the fourth such scan since July of 2022 that have shown that I am cancer free.



This, obviously is an answer to so many prayers! I believe your love and prayers since July of 2021 gave me the strength in the greatest hour of suffering to Rejoice; persevere; to be delivered from despair and to gain so the graces of humility and trust that allowed our Savior to accomplish in me His healing love!

On “OSM” I shared in my spiritual update how each new scan and good report is like the appearances of the Risen Christ to the apostles for it is a renewal of the miraculous gift of the resurrection as a new birth (resurrection) for me in His healing. Every cross, when entered in unceasing prayer, leads to new life!! I thank you for keeping me in your “unceasing prayers” like Lazarus did rejoicing in new life here on earth and the hope of the fullness of life in Heaven!



MORE PRAYERS NEEDED FOR FATHER MIKE SIKON

Father Michael Sikon, pastor of Saint Barbara's parish in Harrison City also is battling Cancer. Fr. Sikon's Doctor shared with him that his recent PET scan is consistent with prostate cancer. 
Journey Through the Ark Encounter



The Grief Share program continues each Monday evening at 6:30 pm at Immaculate Conception in the RCIA Room.


You are welcome to begin attending our GriefShare group at any point. Each session is "self-contained" so you do not have to attend in sequence. The program will run weekly up to middle of July.
