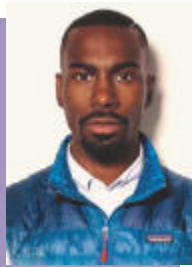

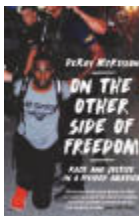
A civil rights activist, DeRay Mckesson focuses his energies on issues of innovation, equity and justice. He has worked to connect individuals with knowledge and tools, and provide citizens and policy makers with commonsense policies that ensure equity and has been praised by President Obama for his work as a community organizer.

He is also the host of the award-winning weekly podcast *Pod Save The People* - which creates space for conversation about the most important issues of the week related to justice, equity and identity and his book, *On the Other Side of Freedom: Race and Justice in a Divided America* has received notable acclaim. Born and raised in Baltimore, he graduated from Bowdoin College and holds honorary doctorates from The New School and the Maryland Institute College of Art. In his book, *On the Other Side of Freedom: Race and Justice in a Divided America*, DeRay Mckesson chronicles his experiences from being involved in the protest of the police shooting of Mike Brown in Ferguson, Missouri. He reflects on the challenges that remain so deeply part of our country where white supremacy has affected nearly every institution in our culture. He also writes honestly about the pain in his heart and what inspires him to remain hopeful still about the promise of justice in United States.

Building A More Just World



At Anshe Chesed Fairmount Temple, we nurture love, justice, hope, joy, connection and growth at every opportunity. These are values of which we are proud. These ideas animate all of the Jewish learning and prayers we offer. They radiate from the opportunities we take with you to sanctify life's most precious moments. They also have historically been part of what motivated our temple to address critical issues in every era since our founding.

- When the U.S. was touched by the last global pandemic early in the 20th century, our Anshe Chesed leaders were nurturing hope to an Anshe Chesed community in Cleveland profoundly affected by that disastrous public health crisis.
- When our nation was at war in WW II, in addition to many members who served in the military, our congregation took pride when the President of the United States asked our Rabbi Barnett Brickner to take time away from the synagogue to bring prayers and love and encouragement for a few months traveling to meet with U.S. troops fighting in Europe to act as a chaplain and a beacon of hope.
- When Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. led, with many others, a civil rights movement intended to restore dignity and work and voting rights and end poverty and oppression to a nation with a long history of racism, he knew that in Cleveland, he could count on our Anshe Chesed community and its Senior Rabbi Arthur J. Lelyveld. Rabbi Lelyveld joined Dr. King in demonstrations in Selma, AL and in Hattiesburg, MS and in Cleveland, OH when the time had come to confront the legacy of Jim Crow and more than a century of oppression against Black Americans.

In the nearly 12 years since my arrival at this synagogue as its Senior Rabbi, I've been impressed with the way in which we have treated the national holiday weekend dedicated to the commemoration of the life and legacy of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. We have developed marquee events to help expose our members and many interfaith neighbors to the enduring commitment to justice, equity and peace that is at the core of our Jewish faith, and central to our members lives. This year will be no different. **We want you to be with us, in person or virtually, to make the holiday weekend honoring Dr. King an inspiring time for you.**

Join us on Friday, Jan. 14, at 6:15 pm, when I will join Rabbi Caruso and Cantor Laureate Sager in a Shabbat Evening Service dedicated to the memory of Dr. King and in celebration of the faith we shared with him during his lifetime. We are thrilled to welcome special guest speaker acclaimed civil rights activist, community organizer, and author DeRay Mckesson. You may recognize DeRay Mckesson from his award-winning podcast *Pod Save the People*. You may have read his inspirational book *On The Other Side of Freedom: Race and Justice in a Divided America*. You may have seen him appear in national media and in demonstrations for police reform around the nation or online sharing his compelling perspective. I will be leading a Monday, Feb. 28, 7 pm discussion on his book, *On The Other Side of Freedom: Race and Justice in a Divided America*. Please join me in this important discussion (see front page).

I hope that DeRoy Mckesson's appearance here at Fairmount Temple will catalyze more engagement within our community for a more just world.

Taking our Temple's LGBTQ Inclusion to New Level



The National LGBTQ Task Force's *Creating Change Conference* is the nation's foremost political, leadership and skills-building conference for the LGBTQ movement. We are pleased to share that our own Elizabeth Kleckner, who teaches in our Religious School High School program, will be participating in a conference in January focused on creating an environment where everyone is free to be themselves in every aspect of their lives.

Today, despite all the progress we've made to end discrimination, millions of LGBTQ people face barriers in every aspect of their lives: in housing, employment, healthcare, retirement, and basic human rights. These barriers must go. Fairmount Temple continues to explore and grow by participation in advocacy programs like the *Creating Change Conference* and what is learned will be taught by Elizabeth, who is one of our dedicated Religious School staff and faculty members.

Elizabeth's class in our High School curriculum will use the text *Mishkan Ga'Avah: Where Pride Dwells* by Rabbi Denise L Eger. The text was brought to her attention by Rabbi Muhlbaum during staff Torah study. This text is a "Celebration of LGBTQ Jewish Life and Ritual."

When asked about the conference Elizabeth replied, "I'm looking forward to so many different sessions but one I'm especially excited about is called 'My religious institution is LGBTQ friendly, now what?' as well as the caucus set up with 'Keshet: For LGBTQ Equality in Jewish Life' and to learn anything and everything I can to help our students navigate this topic with love, compassion and open arms."

This opportunity is being supported by Fairmount Temple's Paula F. Pike Award for Affirmation and Inclusion and additional support from the Jewish Education Center of Cleveland.

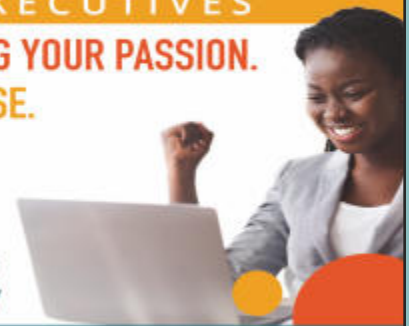
