



Once again, this year, our parish was able to provide a Merry Christmas for just under 1,000 people locally----thanks to all of you!! We were able to work with twelve nonprofit groups as well as with individuals and families in our parish and neighborhood.

Thanks to your amazing generosity, we were able to serve the needs of local parish residents, local families within the Latino community, the residents at Creighton Court, the residents at Marywood Apartments, older adults who are protected by Commonwealth Catholic Charities Guardianship Program, the residents at Gateway Homes, including ten teens who are part of their newly established Adolescent Community, the residents at St. Francis Home, residents at the Laurels of University park, The Daily Planet, Health Brigade, and Virginia Family Services/Associate Educational Services, serving children with ADHD as well as mentally challenged adults.

In addition to the gifts returned from the Giving Tree and the gift cards from our on line shopping, we were able for Thanksgiving to provide a delicious hot meal of roasted turkey and all of the fixings for 125 residents and staff at Marywood Apartments. Our What's Mine is Ours feeding ministry was able to serve the needs for food, and our SNAP Weeks were able to provide cleaning items and paper products for both Home Again, a local shelter for women and children, and the HELP Pantry at Catholic Charities. We are also able throughout the year to help meet the needs of those who show up at our doors each week seeking assistance, and to help them create long range plans to become stable.

None of this would be possible without each of you! Your constant support and generosity are truly amazing! Your faithfulness is a beautiful witness to everyone as you live as Jesus asks us to live-in the service of others! No gift is too small—the seemingly smallest gifts are often the ones that complete the picture and, everyone has gifts to bring to the table! People often say, "We see that St. Mary's does what it says it is going to do!" May we always be a community of believers who seek to serve our loving God by serving our sisters and brothers both here, and beyond our shores and to know that God will provide for all that we need here at the table of plenty.



KENTUCKY TORNADO RELIEF

Our parish is partnering with Christ the King parish in Madisonville, KY, to provide desperately needed assistance to our brothers and sisters in western Kentucky whose lives were devastated by recent tornadoes. The parish in Madisonville has become a key relief provider to thousands of families in nearby Dawson Springs, KY, where dozens of people died, and most of the buildings (including the local parish church) were destroyed. Saint Mary's parish will continue to work in partnership with these two parishes in the months ahead to provide relief and assistance to all of the residents in that area. We have already sent them \$5,000, and we hope to be able to send them much more! NOVENA FOR LIFE

Our faith calls upon us to pray and act, proclaiming the dignity and value of every human life. In the days leading up to the National March for Life, Saint Mary's will host daily Prayers for Life. All parishioners are welcome to participate in this unique opportunity. The Novena Prayers will happen each day for nine days in a row. This brief service will include Scripture readings and special intercessions. The Novena prayers will take place before or after Mass each day in the Daily Mass Chapel for 30 minutes. The prayers will also be available on line so that you can pray them at home. The schedule for the Novena prayers is as follows:

Jan. 13 & 14 - Novena prayers at 9:45 AM, following the Daily Mass

Jan. 15 - Novena prayers at 6:30 PM

Jan. 16 - Novena prayers at 8:30 AM

Jan. 17, 18, 19, 20, 21 - Novena prayers at 9:45 AM

(DID YOU KNOW? The word "Novena" comes from the Latin word *novem*, which means "nine." It refers to the Catholic practice of joining together for public or devotional prayer for nine days. The practice of Novena prayers is ancient in our faith tradition, and offers a way for Catholics to focus prayerfully on important aspects of the Gospel.)
