

Have you signed up for our next Bible Fellowship on the video series "The Chosen?" Below is a **sneak peek** at the first two sessions. You don't want to miss this series!

On January 17th, we will watch Episode One: I Have Called You By Name. In this first episode, we are introduced to Mary Magdalene, who is called Lilith, for most of the episode. The Gospels never refer to Mary as Lilith. The creators of The Chosen probably chose this name because it is associated with demons in Jewish traditions. To prepare for this session, read beforehand: Luke 8:1-3. This is one of the few appearances of Mary Magdalene in the Gospels.

On February 5th, we will watch Episode Two: Shabbat, Episode Three: Jesus Loves the Little Children, and Episode Four: The Rock on Which it is Built.

In episode two, we see a few different Shabbat meals portrayed. We also get a little more background on the difficulties of being Jewish and living under Roman rule. To prepare for this session, read beforehand: **Luke 14:1-24.**

In episode three, we see a group of kids learning from Jesus. By making children (who usually came last in society) into Jesus' first disciples, The Chosen illustrates one of Jesus' favorite principles: "many who are first will be last, and the last first." The amount of care and attention that Jesus gives to them in this episode is heartwarming. To prepare for this session, read beforehand: **Luke 18: 15-17.**

In episode four, we see Jesus teach about what it means to be fishers of men- and trust that God will take care of us. We will see Simon's wife being the spiritual leader of her household by asking Simon, "Where is your faith?" He does not realize how bitter and jaded he has become. This is a great message for us today. This episode also shows Jesus doing a miracle and relaxing on the beach. To prepare for this session, read beforehand: **Luke 5:1-11.**

CHANGE DURING MASS

Have you noticed a change in where the lector reads the week's announcements at Mass? Have you ever given any thought to the Ambo in our church? Many Catholics don't understand the full significance of the Ambo within the Mass and the reverence which it deserves.

The Ambo is the large wooden stand on the right side of the Sanctuary where we read the Scriptures from. Many people call it the pulpit, lectern, or podium. Our Scripture readings in Mass are liturgical acts. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) tells us: "When the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God himself speaks to his people, and Christ, present in his word, proclaims the Gospel."

Like the Altar reveals Christ physically with His people in the Eucharist, the Ambo reveals Christ amidst His people in His word. That makes it much more than just a podium for speeches. The Ambo is the platform from where Jesus speaks and should be revered similarly to how we respect the Altar. That's why our Ambo is designed to match our Altar.

To show the importance of the proclaimed Scriptures, we have made a **small change** that all announcements will occur from Cantor's stand.

You asked, and we listened!! Some of the responses for the survey done in May asked to enhance our Mass experience. We hope with this new small change and explanation; you will more fully embrace the richness of the Liturgy of the Word.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In his Apostolic Exhortation, The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis references a thought from Pope Benedict XVI: "Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." Today we celebrate an encounter with the Person of Jesus Christ! This simple but holy event in time dramatically changes human life, pointing it toward a new horizon and giving it a decisive direction. This is a message and truth that is not meant to be shared with only a select few who qualify but with the entire world. Pope Francis continues saying, "Thanks solely to this encounter or renewed encounter with God's love, which blossoms into an enriching friendship, we are liberated from our narrowness and self-absorption. We become fully human when we become more than human, when we let God bring us beyond ourselves in order to attain the fullest truth of our being."

Look around at people. Where is life heading for them? What gives them direction? Even we who are people of faith can get distracted and lose our focus. God, in all of His fullness, is revealed in Jesus Christ and we can encounter Him! God is tangible, real, vulnerable, poor, and full of wonders, surprises, and opportunities. For those who are struggling and lost, today is a day of great joy. All they have to do is reach out and touch the truth of Christ. This presence is revealed in the poor, exploited, and vulnerable ones who cry out for compassion and love. But it is also found in the faithful ones who see in the Epiphany of God a liberation from structures and systems that hurt us, a narrowness of mind and heart that constricts us, and an absorption in our self-agenda that prevents us from seeing anything other than ourselves as important.

We have been given the charge of preaching this Good News. If only we could find a way to be more effective, it might stand a chance of doing what God intended it to do. There is always tomorrow and our memory of that bright new light that shone so brilliantly that Bethlehem night pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved.
