

On April 2nd, we will watch Episode Seven: "Invitations" and episode Eight: "I am he."

Episode seven starts with a 1300-year flashback to a little-known story of Moses and the Israelites during the Exodus. It includes the portrayal of one of the most famously quoted chapters in the Bible (John 3), the conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus. We will see Jesus continue to call his followers with various backgrounds and personal issues but are prepared to follow their kind, brilliant, miracle-working rabbi anywhere he goes. To prepare for this session, read beforehand: **John 3:1-21.**

Episode eight begins with a flashback to Jacob's Well. Then the episode Fast forwards to Simon's house for a miraculous visit. We will see Jesus and his disciples leave Capernaum while under religious and Roman authorities, pressure. The apostles are still confused but are drawing together and are anxious for the Kingdom to come. To prepare for this session, read beforehand: **John 4:1-42.**
