

## Prayer and Worship

#### SAINT PATRICK

Whether you know him as the man who brought Christianity to Ireland or simply as a reason you eat corned beef and cabbage in March, St. Patrick (415 – 493) is a well-known saint around the world.

Saint Patrick was born in Britain of a Romanized family. At the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders from the villa of his father, a deacon and local official, and brought into slavery in Ireland.

He spent six long years there as a herdsman, during which he turned to his faith for strength. He later escaped back to Britain on a ship, where he was eventually reunited with his family.

His years of captivity changed him and brought out a zeal for God and a yearning to spread the message of Jesus Christ. Despite the constant danger of martyrdom, he continued to travel throughout Ireland where he baptized and confirmed in the name of Christ.

As I write this column, we are preparing for our first Fish and Pierogi Dinner of 2022! With circumstances changing weekly (or daily!), it has been hard to predict how things will go. But one thing never changes the wonderful volunteers that make all our parish events possible! I thank the long-time workers and the brand-new additions to our Lenten Dinner crew. The organizing committee, your pastor, and the parish are very grateful for your faithful help! While things are not exactly normal (we will all be wearing masks), it is good to be more like normal than we have been.

We will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Persico in a little more than a week. OLMC will host both St. Boniface and Our Lady of Mercy confirmation students and their families and sponsors at the Confirmation Mass on March 24 at 7:00 p.m. Thanks to Mrs. Berdis and all our catechists for the preparation of our students over quite a few years. And thanks to our Confirmandi for their faithfulness and commitment to Jesus and His Church.

As we make our way through Lent, I hope that you are enjoying your "Little Books" Lenten Prayer Book. I know that I am. We have a number of other spiritual opportunities you might try during this Lent. We pray the Rosary after our 7:00 a.m. Livestreamed Mass every Thursday. You don't have to participate in Mass and Rosary at 7:00 a.m. You can go to our Facebook page any time during the day (or another day!). We also offer the **Stations of the Cross** every Friday evening at 7:00 p.m. We will also have Stations on Good Friday at 7:00 p.m.. Why not join us for either prayer event or even daily Mass at 7:00 a.m? Take advantage of these ways to grow in prayer and in your relationship with God.

Progress continues on the front of church. When you come to Mass you will probably notice a lot more glass in the front of church. Our workers have been at it all week and will soon be complete with the normal glass replacing the fiberglass panels which are from 1968. Once the new doors are installed, we will restore the remaining two stainedglass windows (Jesus and the Children and the Agony in the Garden) and install them above the doors. Meanwhile, work will begin on the handicap entrance on the side of church. Many thanks to all those whose contributions to the Foundation for the Future Campaign are making all these renovations to our church possible. Don't forget, this is the final year of our campaign.
