BABY BOTTLE FUNDRAISER

Our Knights of Columbus Council at Our Lady of Mount Carmel, has joined all the other councils in Erie and Crawford Counties to conduct a Baby Bottle fundraising drive to benefit the Women's Care Center of Erie for the purpose of purchasing a mobile ultrasound van. This medically equipped vehicle will visit rural areas, as well as our five local Universities to provide valuable, lifesaving services.

In 2021, the Knights provided an ultrasound machine to the Care Center, and in less than a year, 63 previously abortion bound women chose life for their unborn children, after viewing them on this state of the art machine. While this is certainly an achievement, we are now focusing on **helping to raise \$250,000** to purchase a mobile ultrasound van. If the Knights along with the other entities is able to achieve this goal, The Knights of Columbus Supreme Council in Connecticut **will pay the entire cost of the mobile ultrasound machine**, amounting to about \$45,000.

Baby bottles will be available as you leave church the weekend of April 30th and May 1st. **Envelopes are also available for donations** if you would rather make a donation in place of using the bottles. If you are financially able, we ask you to fill them with change, Currency or checks and **return them on Father's Day.** All proceeds will go to the purchase of the mobile ultrasound van. Thoughts on the way up Mount Carmel

What a wonderful First Eucharist we had this past Sunday! Many thanks are due to Sue Berdis and Third Grade teacher, Amy Kehl. The kids did a great job with the readings and intercessions and were really attentive during the entire Mass. Thanks, too, to the families who helped bring their children to this point in their faith and supported them in so many ways. It was great to see so many family members and friends at Mass to help the children understand what a great gift the Eucharist is and what an opportunity to grow closer to Jesus and stay close to him in the innumerable times they can receive Him into their hearts and lives during the remainder of their lives. It was a day to remember in so many ways (what beautiful weather we had on Sunday!), especially for your pastor being with his last First Eucharist class at OLMC!

While we do not have a certain date to end my tenure as your pastor (the Bishop's letter says "on or about July 1"), I do know that the Pastoral Council is planning a modest reception for my final Sunday. It will be great to be with you for these next two months and on the **afternoon of July 3.** But, I would like to be clear: **Please, no gifts!** Cards, notes, emails, etc. would be wonderful and much appreciated. **If you would like** to make a donation to the Foundation for the Future Capital Campaign before it ends on December 31, I would very much appreciate that generous thought as well! And, to those who asked: no, **the Bishop does not ask my permission** regarding my replacement! That's the job of the Personnel Board with the approval of the Bishop. It will be a while before they decide on who that will be.

This past week I received my ticket and permission to concelebrate at the Canonization Mass for Blessed Charles Foucauld and 6 others on May 15 in Rome. Blessed Charles' life is the inspiration for the Jesus Caritas Fraternity (a spirituality program for priests) of which I am a member and a number of religious orders. He was martyred in Algeria by an anti-French desert tribe in 1916. Pope Francis will preside at the Mass in St. Peter's Square on that Sunday and Fr. John Jacquel and I (along with many other fraternity priests from around the US and the world). It will be my first (and likely only) time to attend a canonization ceremony (when a person is proclaimed a saint) and to celebrate Mass with the Pope. I plan to see the inside of the Sagrada Familia Basilica in Barcelona and also the Alhambra, the last Moorish palace in Spain. I will have many pictures and, I hope, a few stories to tell when I get home.

I hope that you are anticipating as much as I am our first Chiavetta's BBQ chicken Dinner on Sunday, May 22 with pickup from 12:15 to 4:00 at 15 minute intervals. Orders are already coming in quickly so get to our website and place your order. If you don't do the computer, call or stop in the office for help with your order. If you want a particular pickup time, you might get your order in soon. There will be a limit on the number of dinners we can deliver in each 15 minute period. But we are able to sell as many dinners as we want as long as the orders are received by Sunday, May 15 at 6:00 P.M. I got my order in!!

I am happy to announce that this past week I signed a contract with Rebecca Wiest, one of our experienced catechists, for the position of Faith Formation Director. Rebecca will direct our K-11 Faith Formation program as we introduce some significant changes being made by the Diocesan Office of Faith Formation. Welcome Rebecca! I want to also thank Sue Berdis who has so capably directed our education programs for nearly as long as I have been pastor. I am very happy to tell you that Sue will be remaining with the parish. As many of you know, Sue has been substituting in our parish office while we figured out how to manage not just the office, but the multitude of technology jobs (like the new Ministry Platform, the Livestream Mass, our website, Facebook, email communication, etc.). Sue has agreed to change from "Temporary" to "Permanent". Her new position will be Parish Office Manager, Technology Director and Director of Adult Education. This latter means that we will be able to continue our in-person and online education programs for adults. There are more Chosen series that we have not yet scheduled. But we will now begin to work on multiple annual Adult Formation programs and Bible Studies. I am very grateful to both Sue and Rebecca, knowing that I will be leaving the education programs at OLMC in very good hands.

Finally, please take note of the **Knights of Columbus fundraiser that starts this weekend**. The project will provide a mobile imaging center for pregnant mothers. Pick up a baby bottle and put your coins and bills in it until Father's Day and support this worthy cause. Have a great first week of May!
