

THOUGHTS ON THE WAY UP MOUNT CARMEL

Dear Friends:

Palm Sunday is next weekend. Each Mass will begin at the **main doors of the church** for the blessing of palms. When you arrive at church, please take the palms you need. You are **free to stay at the entrance for the blessing**, or go directly to your pew. Later that day, please remember to place the blessed palm in a safe place in your home – near a crucifix or other sacred image - or possibly in your car. **Blessed palms remind** you that Christ is welcome in your home, your family, your heart.

You have heard my encouragement to come to **Confession** at some point during Lent – it's the **best way to prepare** for Easter. Fr. Cas and I will be available **this Wednesday** in the church confessionals, anytime **between 5:00-7:00pm**. If it's been a long time since your last confession, or if you don't remember exactly how to do it – don't worry at all. Just let the priest know and **we will walk you through** it very patiently. Other churches are participating – see the list in this bulletin.

Finally, I invite you to consider attending the **Chrism Mass** at St. Peter Cathedral – **Monday, April 3, at 1:00pm.** This Mass happens once a year, during Holy Week, usually at the Cathedral. Bishop Persico blesses the holy oils which will be used this coming year in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Ordination of Priests, and Anointing of the Sick. In addition, all the **priests of the diocese renew the promises** of their ordination. It's a wonderful liturgy – more and more lay faithful are attending. The music will be beautiful.

This Friday will be the third and final **fish dinner**. The first two have been a great success. **I'm impressed** with all the volunteers and helpers, and the **food is excellent!**

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from? If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the **feast of Divine Mercy** has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun, Saint Faustina began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, **speaking a message of mercy and love** for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to **remind the Church of the mercy of God**. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young women, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the **second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday**, "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come." ©LPi
