

THOUGHTS ON THE WAY UP MOUNT CARMEL

Dear Friends:

This past Monday, we held a general parish meeting to present information on several important matters. My estimate is that over 100 parishioners attended and I am happy to say that everyone was respectful and attentive. I've said this before, but I'm impressed by the faithfulness of parishioners here. Here's a brief summary of the presentations:

• **Diocesan pastoral planning**: The diocese has initiated a process to review the parishes in Erie County to determine what adjustments are needed to align us with the current number of active parishioners and active priests. I provided an overview of the process as well as some diocesan statistics which indicate that changes are needed.

• **Our parish**: Deacon Frank provided an overview of our own parish's strengths and concerns, including some statistics regarding sacramental participation here at Our Lady of Mount Carmel. One of the more concerning statistics is Mass attendance. On an average weekend in 1990, approximately 1750 people would attend Masses at OLMC. In the past year, we have averaged 275 people at our three Sunday Masses. In the 1990's, there would be, on average, 78 Baptisms each year. In 2022, we had only two Baptisms. Clearly, similar significant decreases are found throughout the diocese and the Northeast US. Consequently, each diocese and parish needs to adjust to the new realities.

OLMC Parish Financial Status: Jon Bickerstaff, moderator of the parish's Finance Council, presented the financial status of the parish, including the long-term debt owed to the diocese (which accumulated over the past 20 years), as well as the need to address the annual operating budget.

We began and ended the meeting with prayer, and I encourage all of us to continue praying for the Holy Spirit's guidance as we consider our present and future.

The presentations were intended to help parishioners better understand **two possible changes**:

Our Lady of Mount Carmel is one of 34 parishes in Erie County. It is currently a "stand alone" parish, but we *may* need to "partner" with another parish, or "merge" into another parish in order to remain a vibrant faith community. Fuller definitions of partner, merge and vibrant parishes can be found at <u>www.eriercd.org/planning</u>. Bishop Persico indicated that a *preliminary* plan for all parishes in Erie County will likely be presented in late summer or early fall. Once this preliminary plan is presented, we will be invited to prayerfully consider how it impacts OLMC and offer feedback before any final decisions are made.

The parish's long-term debt is approximately \$798,000.00. This accumulated over 20 years when the parish was not able to pay all of its normal assessments to the diocese. One possible way to address this debt is to put the school building up for sale or lease. No decisions have been made, but the Finance Council has entered into discussions with a local real estate consultant to see what interest is out there. We will also need to work on balancing the annual operation budget so that we don't continue adding to the debt.

It's important to know that decisions being made for parishes in our diocese depend on much more than our own statistics and finances. Within the next couple of weeks, Bishop Persico will publish a pastoral letter to help us all understand the realities, the challenges and the possibilities across our 10,000-square-mile diocese. I encourage you to read it so you will have a better understanding of the big picture.

I believe that there is a future for Our Lady of Mount Carmel, but it will require us to makes changes. The Finance Council is actively engaged in addressing the financial challenges. Something which Bishop Persico said recently about the diocese in general applies to OLMC: "We just don't have the parishioners or the priests to continue doing what we used to do." We will continue to share information with you as it becomes available. In the meantime, please keep coming to Mass at OLMC, continue to support the parish with your contributions, your volunteer help, and your prayers.
