

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11



A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners.

This is the week that is . . . a week that is called holy . . . a week that is filled with sacred drama . . . a week of liturgies, services and Masses that point to mystery . . . a week of commemorating a Last Supper, a crucifixion, an empty grave.

Palm Sunday: The crowds wave their branches, sing hosanna, and proclaim: "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord." Just as quickly the crowds seem to evaporate and the mood turns ugly.

Tenebrae: A symbolic descent into the darkness of suffering and death. The ultimate crushing reality of crucifixion, told in the haunting shadows of a darkened church.

Holy Thursday: A last supper with friends that becomes so much more: "Do this in remembrance of me," a lesson to learn about service, a prediction of denial and betrayal, a fearful night in the garden, the arrest.

Good Friday: The trial, the weight of the cross, the torment on a mother's face, the horrified looks of those passing by, the harsh and bitter words shouted, the pounding of nails, the desolation that is expressed: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Holy Saturday: Quiet waiting, hopeful expectation

Easter and its glory: The tomb is empty, rejoicing finds expression, the message is clear: "Why do you seek the living One among the dead? He is not here, but he has been raised."

My dear sisters and brothers, I urge your presence and active participation in the services, liturgies and Masses throughout this Holy Week. Present yourself before our Crucified and Risen Lord. Suffer and die with him so as to rejoice in the new life he assures us.

Please God, bless this Holy Week journey for all the people of Christ the King Parish.

The liturgies during Holy Week are unique and rich in symbolism.

The Mass for Palm Sunday follows the pattern of the day 2,000 years ago when Jesus entered Jerusalem. It includes a Gospel reading outside the church building and the entrance of the priest into the sanctuary while the congregation waves palms. It was during the fourth century in Jerusalem that Christians first starting using palm branches in commemoration of Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. Today, we continue to use palms in most churches on this Sunday, Catholic and Protestant alike. It is one of those traditions of worship that, no matter how far apart we may seem at times, we continue to share due to our common heritage. Palm Sunday is also known as Passion Sunday, because we hear an account of the passion of Jesus Christ during the liturgy.

The Holy Thursday Mass also follows the rhythm of the ancient Last Supper. The presider washes the feet of members of the congregation, like Jesus washed the feet of the disciples. After Mass, all remaining hosts are taken to an altar of repose, where adoration of the Blessed Sacrament occurs late into the night. Parishioners can remain like the disciples in Gethsemane, asked to "watch and pray."

On Good Friday, we celebrate another special liturgical service. Following the Liturgy of the Word, there is a communal reverencing of the cross. The intercessions are solemn and include prayers for many different groups of people, reminding us that Jesus' passion is for the whole world. There is no Liturgy of the Eucharist. Hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday are distributed, after which the tabernacle is empty.

The tabernacle remains empty through Holy Saturday — just as Jesus departed from this earthly world in death. Between death and life, the time holds its breath. For the first disciples, Holy Saturday was a day of silence, sorrow, and waiting. But redemption is already beginning! Jesus descends to the dead and frees righteous souls awaiting eternal life. On our own Holy Saturdays, we too wait in silence. But it is not the silence of disappointment and confusion. It is the silence of anticipation. Soon and very soon, dawn will alight on the horizon, and the stone will be rolled back. Until then, we wait in stillness. and we wait in hope for Easter Sunday!


