






A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Unrelenting horror. . . unimaginable injustice. Witness the violence, the destruction, the death. Families torn apart and separated. People crying out and asking why. It is all the story of Ukraine, but not Ukraine alone. It is every story in every time and place, as though the cross of Good Friday is without end.

Jesus knows. He suffered the torment, the violence of the human condition, and then bowed his head and died. His lifeless body was laid in a tomb where frightened, desolate friends went to grieve early in the morning on the first day of the week. Suddenly, fear turned to wonder when they found the tomb empty. The rock had been moved from the entrance and the women were told by two men in dazzling garments: "Why do you seek the living one among the dead? He is not here, but he has been raised."

Seeing now with eyes of faith and allowing hope to fill their hearts, the women literally ran from the tomb to tell others. Everyone had to hear the good news. There is an end to the anguish. The ugliness of the cross is laid aside, the seeming finality of the grave is vanquished.


The people of Ukraine must live with the hope of resurrection. Families who are shattered by gun violence must live with the hope of resurrection. Individuals who carry the cross of addiction must live with the hope of resurrection. Persons who live each day with a chronic illness and those with a terminal disease must live with the hope of resurrection. All of us, each with our own story of the cross, must live with the hope of resurrection.

Light shines in the darkness because Jesus Christ is the **LIGHT** of the world. There is **LIFE** in abundance because Jesus Christ is risen from the dead. There is **HOPE** because our better selves long for something more, God's glory.

My dear parishioners, I pray that in this season of Easter, you will be filled with **light and life and hope** that comes to us from Christ Jesus our Risen Lord.

Divine Mercy

Saint Maria Faustina Kowalksa (1905-1938) was born in Central Poland, the daughter of a peasant family. She was a nun with the Congregation of Our Lady of Mercy to whom it was revealed that she was to spread devotion to the boundless mercy of God. Today she is known as "the apostle of mercy."

Saint Faustina was canonized a saint by Pope Saint John Paul II in the Great Jubilee Year of 2000. He also promulgated that the first Sunday after Easter be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday with the devotion of the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

Christ the King Parish will honor Divine Mercy Sunday on April 24th with the devotional prayers offered in Saint Edward Church at the 3:00 o'clock hour. All parishioners are welcome to attend and participate, praying that the Divine Mercy of God be showered upon our world.

EASTER JOY!

The Paschal Homily of St. John Chrysostom is read on Easter morning in the Eastern Orthodox Church and Eastern Catholic Churches. An excerpt follows:

If anyone is devout and a lover of God, let him enjoy this beautiful and radiant festival. If anyone is a wise servant, let him, rejoicing, enter into the joy of his Lord. If anyone has wearied himself in fasting, let him now receive his recompense.

If anyone has labored from the first hour, let him today receive his just reward. If anyone has come at the third hour, with thanksgiving let him keep the feast. If anyone has arrived at the sixth hour, let him have no misgivings; for he shall suffer no loss. If anyone has delayed until the ninth hour, let him draw near without hesitation. If anyone has arrived even at the eleventh hour, let him not fear on account of his delay. For the Master is gracious and receives the last, even as the first; he gives rest to him that comes at the eleventh hour, just as to him who has labored from the first. He has mercy upon the last and cares for the first; to the one he gives, and to the other he is gracious. He both honors the work and praises the intention.

Enter all of you, therefore, into the joy of our Lord, and, whether first or last, receive your reward. O rich and poor, one with another, dance for joy! O you ascetics and you negligent, celebrate the day! You that have fasted and you that have disregarded the fast, rejoice today! The table is rich-laden; feast royally, all of you! The calf is fatted; let no one go forth hungry! Let all partake of the feast of faith. Let all receive the riches of goodness. Let no one lament his poverty, for the universal kingdom has been revealed. Let no one mourn his transgressions, for pardon has dawned from the grave. Let no one fear death, for the Savior's death has set us free.
