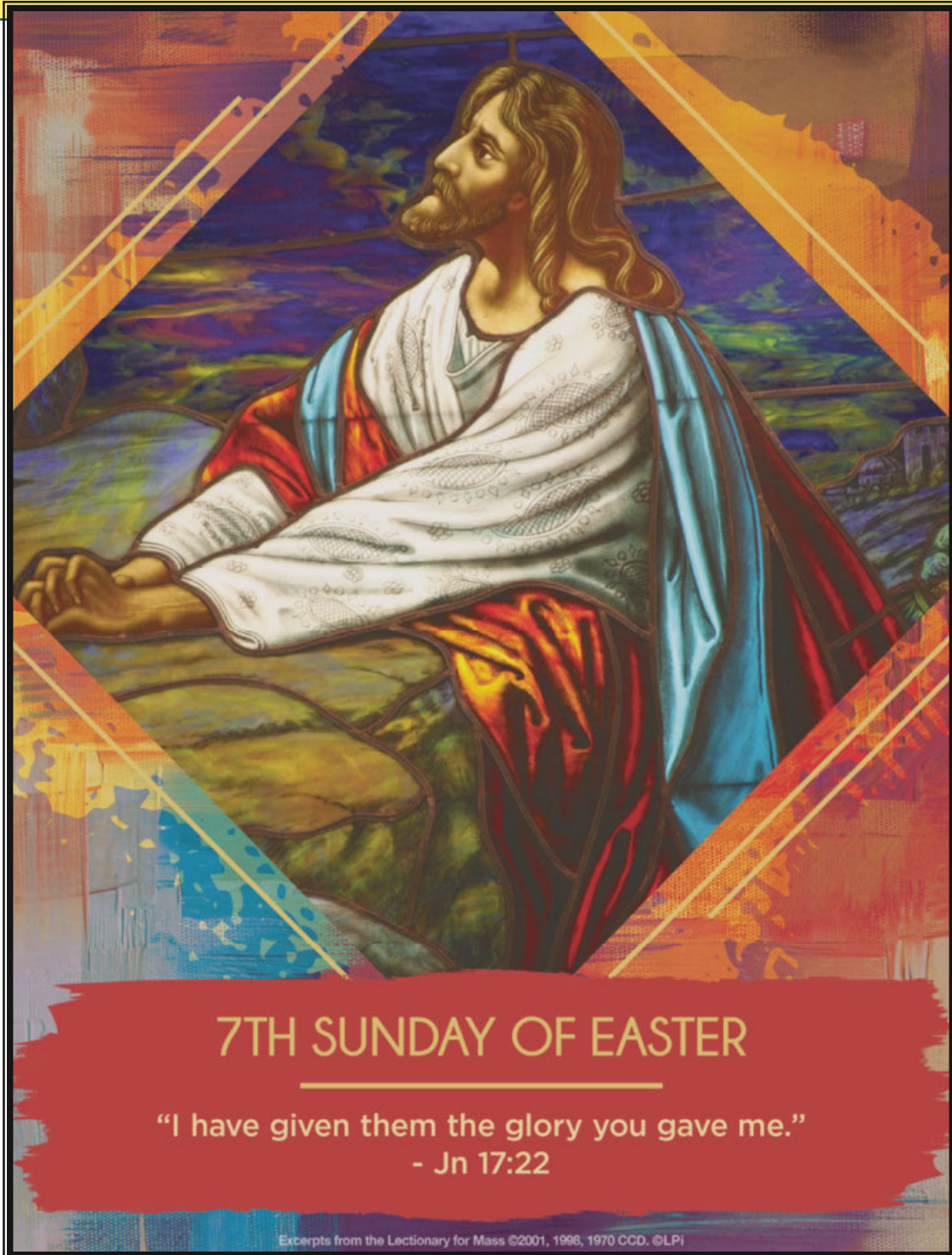

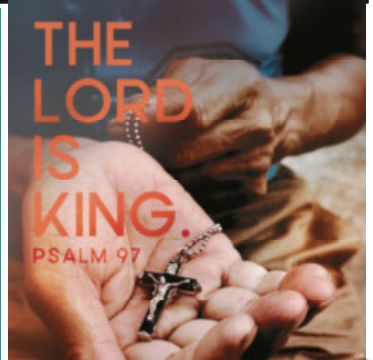



# A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

40 days of Lent and 50 days of Easter equals 90 days. Simple math but so much more. Trace the 40 days from the desert to the cross to the empty tomb, to the news of Resurrection: “**He is not here . . . He has been raised.**” And what followed? Appearances to intimate friends, the apostles, groups of disciples, crowds of believers. Jesus showed and assured them that He was alive. For 40 days after His resurrection Jesus appeared, spoke and taught, preparing His followers for His eventual departure: “**Then He led them out as far as Bethany, raised His hands, and blessed them. As He blessed them He parted from them and was taken up to heaven**” (Luke 24: 50-51).

What came next? Following Jesus’ ascension into heaven, the believers waited in wonder and expectation. They hoped and they prayed. They recalled Jesus’ promise that the Father would send them an Advocate, the Holy Spirit who would be with them always. “**When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind . . . and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit**” (Acts of the Apostles 2: 2-4).

My dear brothers and sisters, the movement of Jesus Christ speaks to the great Lent/Easter journey: 40 days from Ash Wednesday to Resurrection . . . 40 days from Resurrection to Ascension . . . 10 days from Ascension to Pentecost . . . 90 days that encompass a lifetime.

Like Jesus’ first followers, we spend the whole of our lives being formed and fashioned into the ways of God, making the daily effort to *rediscover, reconnect and recommit* to all that is good and holy. However, more than the alliteration of words, even more than a vision for Christ the King Parish, faith formation demands that we walk with Jesus . . . believing, hoping and loving all that He taught us to live.

Confident in the Spirit and assured of God’s promise to be with us always, we go forward.

**Memorial Day Mass:** Our nation remembers and honors those men and women who wore the uniform of the military in service to our country and gave their lives in defense of liberty. We prayerfully commend them to God in gratitude for their sacrifice. Please join

us for Mass on **Monday morning, May 30<sup>TH</sup>, beginning at 10:00 o’clock in Saint Joseph Church.** This will be the only Mass in Christ the King Parish on Memorial Day.

**Be Sure to Wear Red on Pentecost:** The universal feast of Pentecost is next Sunday, June 5<sup>TH</sup>, when the Church celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles who “*were all in one place together . . . then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them.*”

When you come to Mass on Pentecost Sunday wear your red clothing—your red shirt or blouse, your red pants or skirt, your red shoes and your red socks. Everyone, from the youngest to the oldest, is asked to color the churches of Christ the King Parish with the brightness of red. Invoke the Holy Spirit to symbolically inflame our commitment to Jesus Christ and help us to **rediscover, reconnect and recommit** to all that is good and holy.

**Holy Hour and Benediction:** On the First Thursday of every month in Christ the King Parish you are invited to come before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament for quiet prayer and reflection. A whole hour of silence might scare some people away, but it is a time filled with grace and power from God. You are invited to gather on Thursday evening, June 2<sup>ND</sup>, from 6:30 to 7:30 in Saint Edward Church in Blawnox. Remember the acronym: A.C.T.S. - adoration, contrition, thanksgiving and supplication.

**Missionary Cooperation Sunday:** Christ the King Parish has been asked to help support the **Sister Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary** with their motherhouse in Scranton and their mission work in Peru. The IHM Sisters minister to the people of Peru during political instability, food shortages, the COVID pandemic and natural disasters. They have also established a boarding school for girls from remote villages so that these young women can attend high school, the only educational opportunity available to them.

Realizing that it has been a difficult few years for all of us, please be as generous as possible when the collection basket is passed a second time next weekend, June 4-5 for the missionary efforts of the Sister Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
