



A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Giving gifts is what we do. Special occasions or no occasion at all, gift giving is an opportunity to share something special with someone who is special. Birthdays and Christmas are particularly appropriate occasions, but so is Valentine's Day, Mother's Day, Father's Day or just any ordinary day. We give gifts because we want to express the assurance of our thoughts... the warmth of our love ... the gratitude of our hearts.

Gift giving is all of God. In the act of creation, in the work of redemption, in the certainty of sanctification, we are gifted by the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. But know this: while the gifts given from God are without end, they also invite our response and cooperation.

We are called *to take care* of this earth as responsible stewards of the gift given to us by our Creator. We are called *to participate* in the weight of the cross as vigilant disciples of our Redeemer. We are called *to bear witness* to the Good News as inspired by our Sanctifier.

The gift of the Holy Spirit, the Sanctifier, the One who makes us holy, is the fulfillment of Jesus' promise that the Father would send an Advocate. Thus, despite uncertainty and fear, the first disciples and the Church today wait with wonder and hope. And so it happened: "When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind . . . then there appeared to them tongues as of fire . . . and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim" (Acts 2: 1-2,4).

The Church has been celebrating ever since, and not just on Pentecost. It is during the ritual of the sacraments of baptism and confirmation that we invoke the power of the Holy Spirit to come down upon those initiated into the life of God: to cleanse them through life saving water and to fill them with the gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord

Friends, know that the power of the Holy Spirit is not held exclusive to the ritual of sacraments and prayer. The mystery of the Spirit cannot be contained in any place or time. The wonder of the Spirit is without end. The hope of the Spirit never ceases.

My sisters and brothers, I pray that the power of the Holy Spirit will enter into your heart, mind and soul. I pray that the Holy Spirit will shake loose within you anything that is not of God. And I pray that the transforming power of the Holy Spirit will help you to *rediscover, reconnect and recommit* to all that is good and holy. In that transformation is found wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. I urge you to commit to memory the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit... but more, to live them.

Missionary Cooperation Sunday: Christ the King Parish has been asked to help support the **Sister Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary** with their motherhouse in Scranton and their mission work in Peru. The IHM Sisters minister to the people of Peru during political instability, food shortages, the COVID pandemic and natural disasters. They have also established a boarding school for girls from remote villages so that these young women can attend high school, the only educational opportunity available to them.

Realizing that it has been a difficult few years for all of us, please be as generous as possible when the collection basket is passed a second time this weekend, June 4-5 for the missionary efforts of the Sister Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.




What does Pentecost have to do with the worldwide Synod process? Everything! In the Acts of the Apostles, St. Luke relates how the assembly of disciples numbered about one hundred and twenty (1:15). "When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together" when the Holy Spirit came upon them (2:1). The Spirit was given to the whole community, not just to a few leaders. In our turn, at baptism, we were given "the power to live and act under the prompting of the Holy Spirit can speak through the diverse voices of the community, if we listen carefully to each other. "The path of synodality seeks to make pastoral decisions that reflect the will of God as closely as possible, grounding them in the living voice of the People of God." (Synod Handbook, 1.3) "The hope is that the experience of the Synodal Process will bring about a new springtime for

listening, discernment, dialogue, and decision-making, so that the whole People of God can better journey together with one another and the entire human family, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit." (Handbook, 3.5)
