A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Editor's Note: This pastor's letter is being printed a second time in the bulletin for those who may have not been in church last weekend and didn't have a chance to read it. The message deserves our careful attention.

Dear Parishioners.

It is not unusual for a public speaker to be subject to potential distractions, e.g., simultaneous conversations or whisperings from the crowd, people moving about while the speaker is addressing them, disruptive behavior, verbal outbursts as objections from the audience or photographers roaming around. In cases like these, the speaker must maintain their concentration in order to remain focused on the subject matter lest they lose their train of thought.

A preacher must be prepared to withstand the same. Yours truly has known all of these plus a few more, including the tardiness of worshippers arriving at Mass during the homily and moving up the aisle to their pew. But recently I was subjected to a whole new distraction. As I was preaching, I watched a member of the congregation lift a container of coffee to their lips and drink. Needless to say, it was distracting, but more I was in disbelief. I could not believe that someone would be so bold. And then it made me think . . . maybe all of us need a refresher in protocol and teaching as it relates to our reverent participation in the Mass and reception of the Holy Eucharist.

May I say first that reverence for the Lord and each other begins at the door of the church and the timeliness of our arrival for Mass . . . before the priest walks down the aisle. Late arrivals have the power to distract, but even as I put these words to paper, I am well aware that there will always be reasons that legitimately explain periodic lateness, e.g., the congestion of traffic, finding parking, getting children ready for church and out of the house, etc., etc.

The most important thing that can be said for arriving at church on time is that we should want to give the fullness of our time to God. It is our small way of giving back to God who gives so much to us. And while speaking of giving to God the fullness of our time, it only makes sense to say something about staying in church until the conclusion of the Mass and when the priest leaves the altar. I'll admit, I regularly see a lot of people in a hurry to get out!

The other matter that deserves our attention is our preparation for receiving Holy Communion. The teaching of the Church is spelled out in the **Code of Canon Law** as it relates to grave sin, receiving the Eucharist twice in one

day, and a proper Eucharistic fast. Canon #916 states that A person who is conscious of a grave sin is not to receive the Body of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.... Canon #917 states that A person who has received the Most Holy Eucharist may receive it again on the same day but only during the celebration of the Eucharist in which the person participates.... Canon #919 states that One who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion.

My dear parishioners, I advise and encourage your faithfulness to this official teaching of the Church as a way of showing reverence for the Holy Eucharist which must be uppermost in our minds. In no small way it explains our respectful bow or genuflection as we place ourselves in a position of awe, wonder and worship before the Lord Jesus. It is also a way of manifesting our full and active participation in the celebration of the Sacred Mysteries of the Mass.



The parish pastoral plan sets the optimal scenario for the Holy Spirit to act among us. It creates the most appropriate local background for the Sacred Purpose of our parish to be animated.

What is happening in the worldwide Synod?

In 2021, Pope Francis launched the Synod for a Synodal Church. Everyone in the church was asked to reflect upon how we "journey together" as a faith community. What joys and obstacles had we encountered along the way? In two sessions during the Spring of 2022, we at Christ the King Parish

took our place among the millions of Catholics all over the world who spoke of our own experiences, listened to the experiences of others, and tried to pay attention to how the Holy Spirit was calling us to join in the mission of spreading the Gospel. The purpose of this creative process was "to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands."

Two reports of synodal meetings from our parish were among 150 syntheses that came to the Diocese of Pittsburgh Synod office from parishes, schools, various lay groups and gatherings, and groups of religious men and women. Reports from all over the world flowed to the Vatican Synod office. Further assemblies and synthesis reports on a continental level have led to a "Working Document," published last Tuesday. This document will provide the basis for discussion by the Synod of Bishops—a gathering of representative bishops from all over the world—in October. They will produce another document which will go out to the worldwide Church for further discernment and comment before the Synod of Bishops reconvenes in 2024 to consider again what the Holy Spirit is saying through the minds and hearts of Catholics around the globe.




