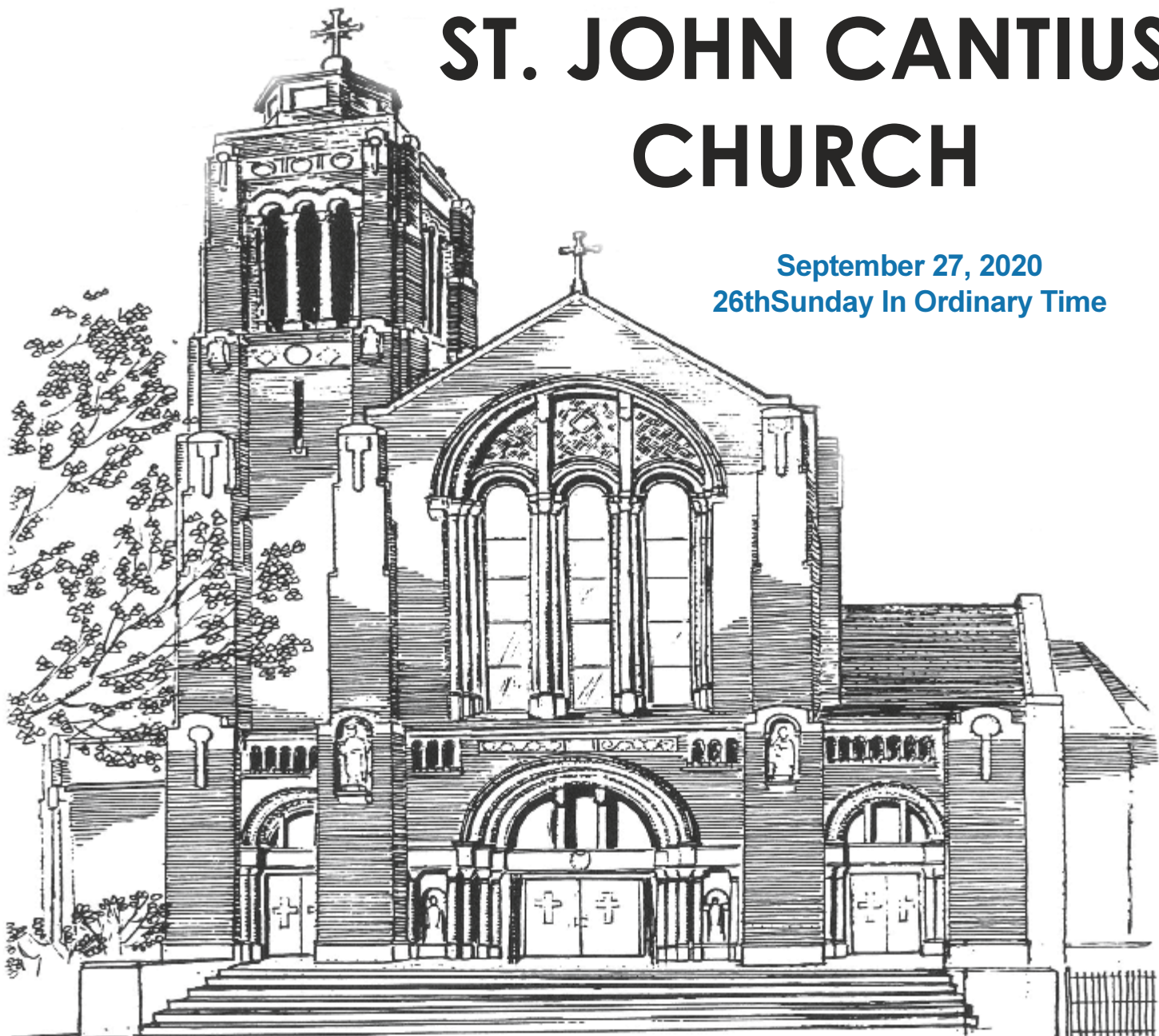

PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

Next Sunday, October 4 we will celebrate the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. St. Francis born “Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone” in 1182 and died in 1226. He was the son of a wealthy fabric merchant in the town of Assisi. One day while walking in the hills of Assisi near a church in ruins, Francis heard the call of the Jesus. Francis curiously looked inside the church in ruins named, San Damiano (St. Damian) and heard the still hanging crucifix tell him, “Francis, go and repair my house which is falling into ruin. . .” Immediately, Francis gathered some of his friends, and they began to re-brick the fallen church of St. Damian. However, this was not at all what his call was about. He eventually realized that He was being called to a much larger task - not to repair a building, but a entire church. Many people in the church during Francis’ time were not being good stewards of God’s church. Francis faced an uphill battle until finally he made it to Rome to have an interview with Pope Innocent III. He expressed his dream about a physically falling to him. The Holy Father felt the beggar was probably just some dreamer that was misguided. Pope Innocent retired that evening and he too dreamed of a physical church falling down. The pillars, windows, and walls were caving in. He realized the next morning that Francis was a messenger from God calling the entire church to reform. He immediately summoned him back and gave his approval for him to being on his mission by approving his followers and founding the Franciscans.

To honor his memory, we will perform pet blessings in our parking lot here at St. John Cantius on October 4th at 3 pm. Please bring your dog, cat, fish, and whatever else you may have as a pet for a special blessing. We will assemble in the parking lot next to the church. Remember to social distance and masks will be required. The service will be about 20 min long with special pet blessing certificates given to each pet owner.
