The Pope asked Catholics to pray, learn about the missions, and offer donations for those working in mission territories as well as all the people they served. His concern was to foster a sense of community responsibility in all Catholics for supporting the Missions throughout the world. The collection for World Missions this year will take place on Saturday/Sunday, October 17/18 and will be the 94th year of celebrating World Missions Sunday since it's inception by Pope Pius XI. The yearly World Mission Sunday celebration reminds each of us of our connectedness to the whole 'catholic' (universal) church and challenges us to share from the many blessings that God has given to us with those in great need. ZIARNO SŁOWA BOZEGO

„Królestwo niebieskie podobne jest do króla, który wyprawił ucztę weselną swojemu synowi. Posłał więc swoje sługi, żeby zaproszonych zwołali na ucztę, lecz ci nie chcieli przyjść”. Chrystus miał na myśli współczesnych Mu ludzi, ale ta Jego przypowieść zawiera wieczną prawdę. Chrystusowa Radosna Nowina jest Bożą ucztą przygotowaną dla człowieka i wszyscy są na nią zaproszeni. Jednak i dzisiaj, podobnie jak 2000 lat temu, wielu zaproszonych nie przychodzi. Jedni gardzą Bożym zaproszeniem, drudzy z lekceważeniem machają na nie ręką, a inni znieważają i prześladują Jego sługi, woląc być katami niż gośćmi na Bożej uczcie. W tych czasach niewiary, walki z Kościołem, masowych odstępstw dziwimy się dlaczego tak wielu zdradza Boga i opuszcza Chrystusa. Przecież nawet wielu naszych znajomych i bliskich, którzy nie tak dawno byli blisko Chrystusa, śpiewali i modlili się razem z nami, są dzisiaj nieprzyjaciółmi Jego Ewangelii i Jego imienia. Niektórzy chrześcijanie wyrzekają się Chrystusa, ponieważ nie chcą żyć według Jego nauki. Nie chcą wierzyć w Boga, ponieważ nie żyją tak, jak On żąda. Bracia i siostry, trzeba koniecznie żyć tak, jak się wierzy, dosłownie i konsekwentnie. Inaczej zaczniemy wierzyć tak, jak żyjemy, to znaczy wielu w ogóle nie będzie wierzyć. Staniemy się nieprzyjaciółmi Boga, ponieważ On jest nieprzyjacielem grzesznego życia. Zawsze się znajda tacy, którzy nie chcą Ewangelii, ponieważ nie chcą według niej żyć, tacy, którzy nie szukają Chrystusa, ponieważ nie chcą Go znaleźć. Wiara i życie stanowią jedną całość. Wierzyć, to znaczy żyć według wiary.
