# **PASTOR'S THOUGHTS**

As Catholics, we believe in a two source theory of Revelation. In other words, how does God let us know about Himself. The two sources are Tradition and the second is Scripture. Recognizing this theory, Pope Francis on September 30, 2019, on the liturgical memorial of St. Jerome, announced that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time would be celebrated as the Sunday of the Word of God. This weekend we remember and thank God for revealing Himself to us in the Bible. The Bible is indeed God's word filled with history, stories, parables, laws, teachings, moral codes, poetry, and many other literary forms. Truly it is a work of art. As one person said, 'the more you read the book, the more you will know it's Author."

Looking ahead, February 3 (Thursday) is the feast of St. Blaise. St. Blaise and his life are shrouded in a lot of mystery. We do however, know a few things about his life. Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebastea and a medical doctor. The first known record of the saint's life comes from the medical writings of Aëtius Amidenus, where he is recorded as helping with patients suffering from objects stuck in their throat. The one story that Blaise is most famous for and one that sparked 'throat blessings' happened on his way to being killed because he would not renounce his faith. The story goes that in 316, the governor of Cappadocia and of Lesser Armenia, Agricola by name, arrested then-bishop Blaise for being a Christian. On their way to the jail, a woman set her only son, who was chocking to death on a fish bone, at his feet. Blaise cured the child, and though Agricola was amazed, he could not get Blaise to renounce his faith. Eventually Agricola beat Blaise with a stick and tore at his flesh with iron combs before beheading him.

I will bless throats after all the weekend Masses February 5th and 6th. Finally, a reminder that the annual Catholic Charities appeal is the weekend of February 19th and 20th. As I get updates on the plaster repairs I will pass those along as well. Right now they are still erecting scaffolding and repairing the two rooms upstairs where the organ will be re-assembled.
