PASTOR'S REFLECTIONS

This weekend we will bless throats after all the Masses as this past week we celebrated the feast of St. Blaise. You will also see blest candles available at the entrances of the church. Candles were blest this past week on the feast of the Presentation of Jesus, often called Candlemas Day. The cost is \$5.00 per box. Many ethnic people including the Polish, often light these candles during inclement weather as a tradition to keep them and their homes safe.

Lent begins in about one month and this year it begins on Wednesday March 2nd (Ash Wednesday). We will celebrate two Masses on Ash Wednesday March 2nd. First, 10:00 am in Polish. Second, 6:30 pm in English. Please note that Ash Wednesday is NOT a holy day of obligation therefore there is NO vigil Mass on Tuesday, the day before. You are encouraged to attend Ash Wednesday Mass to being Lent as a reminder we are all in need of repentance and God's mercy. The diocese has furnished instructions for the distribution of ashes during the pandemic and they will be given as normal, on the forehead right after the homily.

This year to continue to make Stations of the Cross convenient and due to the lack of attendance on Friday's at 630 pm. I will offer stations after both weekend Masses (4pm Saturday and 1130 am Sunday) during Lent for those wishing to remain in church to pray the stations. Please consider attending as it will be quite easy to remain after Mass for about 15 min to pray with the parish community. Perhaps you could commit to this extra prayer experience on the weekends rather than 'giving something up' this Lent. "Word Among Us" guides will also be available for FREE at the entrances of the church. There will be other opportunities during Lent that I will share in the next few weeks.

Finally, I am seeking input to re-design the cry-room space. It's a mess! It is mostly used for storage and the entire room is in poor condition. Some ideas offered were to make it a chapel of Divine Mercy. We have the beautiful picture and relic of St. Faustina Kowalska already on the wall by St. John Paul. We could easily place the painting on the wall and get a larger Reliquary for her relic and place those items inside that cry room space. Some suggested a small Eucharistic Chapel for private prayer. When the church is completed, we could easily lock the side church entrance door and the sacristy door and leave the outside door open for a few hours each day for people to come and pray. Someone suggested a chapel to Helen Pelczar, the Mystic who was a parishioner of our parish. I would need to find out since she is not a saint if we could do this. Any workable ideas will be run past our parish council for consideration. If you have any thoughts or ideas on how to better utilize the space, please give me a call.

BLESSED CANDLES

In the Polish tradition, the legend relates that Mary, the Mother of God of the 'Blessed Thunder Candle" (Matka Bosnia Gromniczna), watches over the people on cold February nights. The thunder candle wards off deadly wolves and protects peasants from harm. Many today take these blest candles (Gromnica) and keep them in their homes to light during storms, lightening, and any inclement conditions. In Poland, the dying are often given the Gromnica to help light their way to eternity.

These blest candles will be available for purchase for \$5.00 per set of two after all weekend Masses February 5/6.
