PASTOR'S CORNER

The repairs on the inside of the church are fairing well. The work, according to our contract is scheduled to be "substantially completed" by April 7, 2022. Please bear with me but I keep seeing the result which is how I am surviving when I say Mass with all the ladders, paint, and scaffolding. There will be an end; that's what I keep telling myself.

Some of you may never have had the opportunity to receive the sacrament of Confirmation as children. If anyone is interested in being Confirmed by the Bishop, please contact me at the rectory. This opportunity would be for adults who for whatever reason, missed this opportunity to be confirmed. It is not for unbaptized persons wishing to come into the Catholic Faith. That is the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). There will be a few classes held by me so that those adults wishing to receive the sacrament understand what they are asking for. We would review the theology of sacraments in general then go more in depth with a study of the specific sacrament of Confirmation.

On March 1st at 6 pm, I have invited the Festival Committee to re-assemble to come up with a new date for 2022. The one day event was a tremendous success. Expenses for last year's Dingus Day ran \$ 18,791.00. Our income after expenses, \$12,084.00. While we all had a great time, we are going to take a look a curbing our expenses this year to better maximize the income for our parish. If you have any ideas or wish to review our financials details of expenses, please don't hesitate to offer your ideas. All ideas are welcome! I can promise this year will be another great success for our parish because of the great response of volunteers from our St John Cantius Parish family.

Finally, the Holy Father Pope Francis is interested in your opinion! In April 2021, Pope Francis initiated a synodal journey of the whole People of God, beginning in October 2021 and culminating in October 2023 in the Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. The entire People of God, in all its diversity, is invited to participate in the upcoming Synod which will focus on the three pillars of a Synodal Church: communion, participation and mission. This will be facilitated on a parish level by having a brief session seeking your opinion on the church. I have appointed Mary Ann Kocurko and Frank Budziak to facilitate this event. We ask you to please attend this brief session right after Mass the weekend of March 19/20. The event will be hosted in the lower hall in the High School. Refreshments will be served as well. Please mark your calendar for this event. Remember, your opinion counts and pope Francis wants to know.

ZIARNO SŁOWA BOZEGO

"Błogosławieni jesteście wy, ubodzy..."a jednocześnie "biada wam bogaczom..", "Błogosławieni wy, którzy teraz głodujecie..." ale "biada wam, którzy teraz jesteście syci...". "Błogosławieni wy, którzy teraz płaczecie...", ale biada wam, którzy się teraz śmiejecie...". Takie słowa zyskują i przerażają. W ludzkim bowiem pojęciu wypchany portfel, pełny żołądek i życie wypełnione śmiechem i uciechą – to jest błogosławieństwo. Jezus zać mówi, "biada". Puste kieszenie i żołądek, prześladowanie i łzy, to dla nas bieda; Jezus zaś powiada takim "błogosławieni".W pierwszej chwili takie kazanie wzbudza sprzeciw. Słowa Jezusa były skierowane przede wszystkim do ludzi tamtych czasów. Wtedy, w większym stopniu niż dzisiaj, ubodzy byli rzadko syci i weseli - częściej byli głodni, wyzyskiwani, prześladowani przez bogatych. Chrystus staje w obronie ubogich, a karci bogatych. Dla Zydów w tamtych czasach bogactwo było znakiem błogosławieństwa Bożego, wybrania oraz rękojmi zbawienia; przeciwnie, ubóstwo uważano za znak przekleństwa i odrzucenia ze strony Boga. Jezus prostuje te poglady, twierdzac, że najcześciej bogaci bywaja odrzuceni, a ubodzy znajdują łaskę u Boga.Słowa Jezusa odnoszą się również do słuchaczy wszystkich czasów. Dzisiejszemu człowiekowi także mówi: "Błogosławieni jesteście wy, ubodzy, albowiem do was należy królestwo Boże". Nie dlatego, że są ubodzy, ale dlatego, że są świadomi, iż nie zawsze mogą zdobyć bogactwo, że zawsze moga dojść do Boga, który jest największym bogactwem człowieka. Nie są dla Jezusa ideałem bazdomne, głodne, nagie, prześladowane sieroty. Takich w sprawiedliwym społeczeństwie być nie powinno. Ubodzy sa bliscy Jego sercu dlatego, że mają bardziej otwarte serca i uszy na Jego słowo, na to co wieczne i nieprzemijające, na wewnętrzne bogactwo ducha, na szczerość, miłość i ofiarność. "Błogosławieni jesteście wy, ubodzy". Jezus mówi z własnej obserwacji i doświadczenia. Ubodzy ludzie pracy, uciemiężeni i prześladowani wierzyli Mu; natomiast możni i bogaci ukrzyżowali Go. Dla realizacji swego posłannictwa nie gromadził wokół siebie możnych, uczonych i bogatych. Wybrał tych, których nikt nie chciał; biedaków, rybaków i wieśniaków, prostych i prześladowanych, oni zanieśli Jego Ewangelię światu.
