PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

The biblical event in this weekend's Gospel is the celebration of the transfiguration of Jesus. After Jesus performs a series of miracles and foretells His own death, Jesus leads just three of his disciples, Peter, James and John, to a "high mountain." This is where the Transfiguration takes place in which his appearance was radiantly transformed and Jesus appears in a dazzling way to Peter, James, and John.

The transfiguration of Jesus Christ is a powerful demonstration of His divine nature and manifestation of His glory, which Jesus possessed prior to coming to earth in the human body. I believe the Transfiguration gave his disciples hope that despite Jesus being taken away, they would, with His help, be the leaders of his new church. I am sure they had no idea what was in store for them or how they would suffer on account of Jesus once He left. This often is difficult for us to comprehend as well especially when life can sometimes seem hopeless. Keeping the Transfiguration in mind despite how challenging and difficult things can sometimes be (I think about the Ukrainian people and those people in war torn countries and those being mistreated) Jesus assures us He will never leave us orphaned. Let us continue to pray for peace throughout our world and most especially for those in the Ukraine.

A reminder that the weekend of March 19/20th we will be hosting a synod after all Masses to get your feed back on some issues of where the church is today and where we need to be in the future. This discussion was spurned last year in a Synod led by Pope Francis and he want's your opinion and thoughts. Join us for a brief 40 minute session after one of the weekend Masses March 19/20 to express your opinion and reflections on our church. Finally, please stay after Mass this Lent to pray the Stations of the Cross. It's convenient, only 15 minutes, and a great way to follow in the footsteps of our crucified Lord. Perhaps it could be a sacrifice offered up for those suffering in the Ukraine. God Bless, Fr. Roach

DISPENSATION

Friday, March 25, is the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. Solemnities are not observed as penitential days. Therefore, by virtue of the law (can. 1251) and the liturgical nature of the day, penitential practices, like fasting or abstaining from eating meat, are not required on this day, even though it falls on a Friday in Lent.
