Pastor's Thoughts

This weekend our country celebrates "Labor Day." It is a strange celebration without a lot of ritual except for some we have created like picnics, parades, and barbecuing. The US Department of Labor Defines Labor Day as "a creation of the labor movement and is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers. It constitutes a vearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country." The Catholic Church exercised a prominent role in the formation of the America's labor movement. In 1891, Pope Leo XIII wrote an encyclical letter entitled "Rerum Novarum" (New Things) that articulated the Catholic Church's teaching on the importance of work as it helps instill dignity and purpose in the lives of people. Pope Leo criticized the concentration of wealth for only a few at the top; He spoke out against the abuses that workers faced in the workplace; He demanded that workers be granted certain rights and safety regulations and be entitled to work under safe conditions. The encyclical emphasis the fact that work instills a sense of dignity, pride, and gives meaning and purpose to our lives. This weekend we pray for workers, for better working conditions, and those who find themselves unemployed or underemployed. We also remember our parents and those who helped instill a good work-ethic in our lives.

We are about 6 weeks away from October 22nd, our Parish Festival, 1/2 to Dyngus Day. We are in need of your help as we embark on a bigger festival this year! This event is our major fund raiser for the year. We need everyone's effort for this event to work. The funds go completely for capital improvements. ZIARNO SŁOWA BOZEGO

Dziś Pan Jezus ostrzega nas, że zbawienie jest dla człowieka kwestią poważną i zasadniczą w życiu. Trzeba więc podejmować wysiłki, aby je sobie zabezpieczyć. Nie wolno zapomnieć, że droga do zbawienia nie jest usłana kwiatami; zbawienia nie osiąga się z założonymi rękami, spokojnie drzemiąc w jakimś pociągu, który nas tam bezpiecznie zawiezie. Chrystus ostrzegał Żydów, że przed Bogiem na nic się nie przyda ich żydowska krew, ani to, że go widzieli i słyszeli. Biletem wstępu do królestwa Bożego jest wiara i dobre uczynki, a nie sama krew Abrahama. Nasz sposób myślenia i postępowania jest bardzo często podobny, do tamtego żydowskiego z czasów Jezusa. Wielu wyobraża sobie, że się zbawią przez to samo, że zostali ochrzczeni, zapisani w księgach metrykalnych i kilka razy w roku pokazują się w kościele. Sądzą, że Bóg im to zapewnił bez ich osobistego wysiłku, wyrzeczenia i ofiary. Tymczasem łaska Boża jest zbawcza dłonia wyciagnieta do wszystkich, ale każdy musi uchwycić te dłoń. Droga do królestwa Bożego wiedzie obok drzwi każdego z nas, ale każdy musi na nia wejść. Zbawienie zawsze kosztuje. Od pysznego i zarozumiałego człowieka domaga się posłuszeństwa Słowu Bożemu. Zbawienie kosztuje, ponieważ musimy często wyrzekać się zła, którego tak wiele kryje się w każdym ludzkim sercu. Wreszcie zbawienie kosztuje, gdyż tak wiele kosztowało Boga. Dla naszego zbawienia stał się On człowiekiem i poniósł śmierć na krzyżu.
