FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners.

Merry Christmas to all, and blessings for a happy and healthy New Year! The Octave of Christmas just ended with the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, but we are still in the liturgical season of Christmas until the Baptism of the Lord on January 9th. The crowds were smaller than expected for Christmas, but Covid is taking its toll at both parishes. I continue to pray that everyone stays as safe and healthy as possible moving into the New Year. Both Our Lady of Hope and Saint Mary were decorated so beautifully for the Christmas season, and I want to thank all the volunteers on the decorating committees of both parishes who gave of their time and talent to make the churches look so festive. Thanks also to the music ministries of both parishes for adding great richness and beautiful song to the liturgical celebrations. It was wonderful to hear the singing this year as opposed to the instrumental music that was necessitated by Covid last Christmas. Many thanks also to the Eucharistic ministers, lectors, altar servers, ushers, sacristans, money counters who faithfully minister at both churches. All your efforts are deeply appreciated!

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. We only know the story of the Magi from Matthew's Gospel, and they probably traveled from the Kingdom of Persia, which would be modern-day Iran. The Magi were skilled in philosophy, medicine, and natural science. According to Matthew's Gospel: "When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem saving, 'Where is the newborn king of the Jews?" (Mt 2:1) It was later assumed in the Tradition, that since there were three gifts, there must have been three magi. Later tradition increased the status of the wise men, making them kings. There were three of them: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. According to the Bible, the Magi brought gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Since the Epiphany is a feast which remembers the gifts brought to Christ, it is a most appropriate time to give a big "Thank You" to all of you who sent me cards and gifts for Christmas. Thanks also to those who participated in the St. Mary Giving Angel and the OLH Giving Tree. Your thoughtfulness is heart-warming.
