

FROM FR. ISIDORE MUNISHI

Dear Parishioners.

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year 2022. Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord. This brings to an end the season of Christmas. The Church recalls Our Lord's second manifestation or epiphany which occurred on the occasion of His baptism in Jordan. Jesus descended into the River Jordan to sanctify its waters and to give them the power to beget sons of God. The event takes on the importance of a second creation in which the entire Trinity intervenes. Although He appeared in the "substance of our flesh" and was recognized "outwardly like unto ourselves", He was absolutely sinless and impeccable.

The final line of this Sunday's reading from Matthew's gospel offers perhaps a better clue about the meaning of Jesus's baptism. That line reads: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." There we hear an unmistakable echo from the first reading: "Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one with whom I am pleased" (Isaiah 42:7). It is Jesus who will be the definitive "covenant of the people" and "light for all nations." He will "open the eyes of the blind" and "bring out prisoners from confinement, and from the dungeon those who live in darkness."

As another Christmas fades into the past and we prepare to move on next week to ordinary time, these readings help us to understand more fully the meaning of the incarnation – of why Christ has come. As Pope Francis noted in a recent general audience, the good news of the incarnation is not merely that God has taken on human flesh, but that God has done so in a world "marked by so many things, good and bad, marked by divisions, wickedness, poverty, arrogance and wars." Jesus has come to bring God's merey to the world.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that "Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons [and daughters] of God; we become members of Christ, incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission" (CCC #1213). Just as Matthew's gospel makes a connection between the Baptism of the Lord and the mission of the suffering servant, we too should make a connection between our own baptism and his ministry of mercy.


