


ST. JOHN VIANNEY

Baptisms: Every Sunday at 1:15 pm, except the first Sunday of the month. Arrangements must be made in advance by calling the Parish Office. Parent Baptism Preparation Class is required for your first child.

Marriages: Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the marriage. Please call one of the Parish priests to begin the arrangements.

Holy Orders & Vowed Religious Life: Anyone interested in ordained or vowed religious life is invited to talk to one of the parish priests or pastoral staff members.

Ministry to the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is available upon request. The parish staff members regularly bring Eucharist to the sick upon request. Please notify the Parish Office in case of hospitalization.

Eucharistic Adoration: Would you consider an hour a week with the Lord? If you would like to spend an hour in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, call the Parish Office for the combination to the door.


Hello!

Dear Parishioners,



Congratulations to Rob and Marge Smith who celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary on Friday, May 27. They were married at Saint Robert Church in Euclid by Father Jim Caddy and he joined them at an anniversary party last week. I had the chance to give them a special anniversary blessing when they attended Mass in our chapel on Friday, their actual anniversary day. Later this month, the Bishop will gather at the Cathedral for a Mass to celebrate the 50th wedding anniversary of married couples from around the Diocese. Registration was required for this event. It is a nice annual event in our Diocese.

Last Sunday afternoon our parish was asked to host the 50th anniversary of ordination for Father Mark Hollis, a priest of our Diocese. The Mass was celebrated by Father Hollis and many of his family and friends joined him for the happy occasion, including an archbishop, a bishop elect and 20 concelebrating priests. It was a nice celebration and I am glad that we were able to host the Mass in our church and the dinner in our Social Center. Later this week, on Friday, I will celebrate the 44th anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood. Of the original 12 men in my class, six of us are still serving in the Diocese as parish priests—most of us are pastors. We will gather soon to celebrate as a class.

I celebrated Mary and Mike's wedding on June 14, 2014, and I baptized three of their other children: Madeline, Michael and Margot. They are a great family and I am grateful for Mary's membership on the Parish Finance Council. There is a Baptism Class, today, on June 5, at 1:15, in the chapel for parents who wish to have their first child baptized. The Baptism Class is offered at our parish on the first Sunday of every other month. Father Dober is the teacher of the class this month.

On Monday of this week, the pastoral staff members will spend a good part of the day planning activities for the coming year. We review the school year which is now coming to an end and we discuss what we may wish to do differently in the coming year or what new things we may wish to start at the parish. Some of the areas we look at include All Saints School, PSR, Faith Formation programs, all the sacramental programs (Baptism, First Penance and Communion, Confirmation, and Pre-Cana), Liturgical Seasons (Advent, Lent, Easter), Strategic Plan, all the parish organizations, special events, use of space, budget and more. There is a lot of material to

cover and it typically takes all day to begin this process of review and planning. We continue to work on these things throughout the summer and we do the best we can to be ready for the start up of activities in the fall. We end the day with dinner and this year we will take some time at the dinner to also express our gratitude and appreciation to Stan Lipinski who has helped us so much in the Business Office for the past two years. We will also welcome to the staff as a full-time member of the pastoral staff Katie Cooper, our music director, who has been working with us as a part-time employee for the past year while she finished her work at Saint Joseph Academy. It will be great to have her with us now as a full-time employee. She has done a great job helping us this past year since the retirement of Barb Visocky Adams. Barb actually did not get much of a break after she left us. Father Tony Sejba, our former parochial vicar, tapped her to help him at his parish in Medina until he could find a replacement for his music director. Our parish has also hired an individual who will soon begin to serve here as a Property/Facilities Manager. A number of parishes have begun to hire such a person who can help the pastor to care for all the buildings that are part of a large suburban parish like our own. I will have more information about him in next week's bulletin. Please continue to pray for all of us who work here and ask the Lord to help us minister well and serve you in the way you deserve as the people of God. May we do all things for the greater honor and glory of God.

On the following Monday, June 13, we are going to close the Parish Office for the day so that all the support and pastoral staff members can work together to clean the Parish Office Center and the Philomena Center. This is something we need to do as we have accumulated more and more things over the years and have begun to run out of storage space. Many of you do something like this in your own homes each year—some spring cleaning and a time to determine what to keep and what to toss. Wish us good luck! Fr. Johns



Father Johns spoke at all of the Masses last weekend to update parishioners on the status of the Rays of Mercy Campaign and to announce that work has begun on the roof project. He began by thanking the 476 families or individuals from the parish who in the last few months made pledges or donations to the Rays of Mercy Campaign. Their gifts helped us to raise \$1.7 million for the project which includes caring for our sacred spaces at the parish, improving communication and updating technology, and increasing and enhancing the programs we have at the parish to better proclaim the gospel to all and to build the kingdom of God in our community.

Father Johns also encouraged other families and individuals of the parish to do whatever they are able to do to support this campaign in the coming months - to make a pledge or a donation or to increase weekly giving to the parish. In addition to the \$1.7 million (in pledges or donations) which has been raised so far, we are taking \$1 million from our investments and placing it in the Rays of Mercy account to help us achieve our goal of \$3.75 million. At this point, therefore, we have a total of \$2.7 million in the campaign account and we are in need of an additional \$1 million to help us achieve all that the campaign funds are designated to accomplish in the coming years. It is a good plan and will help our parish to be the parish the Lord calls us to be. Our parish was founded in 1969 and Father Kline and Father Johns have led us well in the past 53 years. We look forward in hope and with confidence that the parish will continue to be one of the best in the county. Work has begun on the roof. The cross on the roof should be painted soon and work will continue on the roof of the former church and then proceed to the roofs of the current church. Please pray for the safety of all the workers and for God's blessings on all that we do at the parish.
