

Transcendent Verse

Mending Wall BY ROBERT FROST

Something there is that doesn't love a wall, That sends the frozen-ground-swell under it, And spills the upper boulders in the sun; And makes gaps even two can pass abreast. The work of hunters is another thing: I have come after them and made repair Where they have left not one stone on a stone, But they would have the rabbit out of hiding, To please the velping dogs. The gaps I mean, No one has seen them made or heard them made, But at spring mending-time we find them there. I let my neighbor know beyond the hill; And on a day we meet to walk the line And set the wall between us once again. We keep the wall between us as we go. To each the boulders that have fallen to each. And some are loaves and some so nearly balls We have to use a spell to make them balance: 'Stay where you are until our backs are turned!' We wear our fingers rough with handling them. Oh, just another kind of out-door game, One on a side. It comes to little more: There where it is we do not need the wall: He is all pine and I am apple orchard. My apple trees will never get across And eat the cones under his pines, I tell him. He only says, 'Good fences make good neighbors.' Spring is the mischief in me, and I wonder If I could put a notion in his head: Why do they make good neighbors? Isn't it Where there are cows? But here there are no cows. Before I built a wall I'd ask to know What I was walling in or walling out, And to whom I was like to give offense. Something there is that doesn't love a wall, That wants it down.' I could say 'Elves' to him, But it's not elves exactly, and I'd rather He said it for himself. I see him there Bringing a stone grasped firmly by the top In each hand, like an old-stone savage armed. He moves in darkness as it seems to me, Not of woods only and the shade of trees. He will not go behind his father's saying, And he likes having thought of it so well He says again, 'Good fences make good neighbors.'



Every physical human invention, at some point, degrades, and it can be surprising how quickly nature may take over a neglected parking lot or playground. One spiritual lesson we could take from this natural reality is that we are not meant to put our stock in a world that fades but in a world that is eternal. Robert Frost offers another lesson: some human inventions stifle the natural order and the good which it imparts on humanity.

In this poem, the speaker says twice, "Something there is that doesn't love a wall." One can call that 'something' the natural order, but we would call it God, who made that natural order. Frost juxtaposes this line with another repeated phrase from the neighbor who says, "Good fences make good neighbors." Frost suggests that the neighbor's line is a human invention that conflicts with the truth nature wants to express. Nature desires to topple walls and blur lines of separation, while people often conclude that it's best to make distinctions between groups and properties and avoid unnecessary intermingling.

Especially this Sunday as we highlight the gift of Christ's Body and Blood, we should recognize the ways we focus on secluding ourselves from our neighbors and strive to grow in deeper union with each other. In receiving the Eucharist, we don't only unify ourselves with the Son of God but also with the entire worshiping body of Christ, the Church. As we unite spiritually with our brothers and sisters, let us work to unite with them personally, inviting them to our homes, meeting someone new, or bring someone to the parish who would benefit from the Body of Christ in the Eucharist and in the our community of faith.



Reviving the Roman Catholic Church in Eastern Russia

Dear Parishioners,

Next weekend, June 25 & 26, Father Daniel Maurer, from Mary Mother of God Mission Society and the Vladivostok Mission, will visit our parish to give the annual summer Mission Appeal. He will speak about the Roman Catholic Mission Churches in Eastern Russia. In the early 1900s, the Russian Far East boasted a thriving Roman Catholic population. After the revolution of 1917, Russia became a land without churches and without God. Under Stalin, all Catholic churches were confiscated and dioceses were closed. Most churches were desecrated or destroyed and Catholics were murdered by the hundreds of thousands. In 1992, two American priests, Father Dan and a colleague, Father Myron, arrived in Vladivostok to help re-establish the Church in this region and provide charitable assistance to the many poor. Now that the foundations have been laid, additional priests and sisters are joining the work, and parishes are growing and multiplying, very slowly, but surely. Father Dan will ask for our prayers and for our financial support in a second collection at Mass next weekend. Please be generous and welcome him to our parish.

On this Father's Day Weekend, we give thanks to our heavenly Father for the gift of our own fathers and the other men in our life who help us to be good Christians. If your dad is deceased, pray for the repose of his soul, and, if you are lucky to still have your dad alive and well, say or do something today to make the day special for you and for him.

We will remember our dads in all the Masses this weekend. Speaking of good fathers, we should remember Father Robert Kline on this Friday, June 24. It will be the 11th anniversary of his passing. The 8:00 morning Mass on that day will be offered for him. His niece recently sent to me a picture of Father
